When the handbell rings, all stand for the entrance of the Choir and Clergy.

Introit Hymn: #296 For all the Saints (vv1-4, 8)

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**

Peter says to Jesus, 'Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you.' *John 21.17*

Let us pray (*please kneel*)

Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hidden: Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you and worthily magnify your holy name, through Christ our Lord. Amen.

We are surrounded by a great cloud of witnesses.

Choir sings: Kyrie

Kyrie eleison. Christe eleison. Kyrie eleison

Lord, have mercy. Christ, have mercy. Lord, have mercy

Let us then run our race, laying aside every weight and bringing our sins to the Lord in penitence and faith.

Merciful God, our maker and our judge, we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, and in what we have failed to do: We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbours as ourselves; we repent, and are sorry for all our sins. Father, forgive us. Strengthen us to love and obey you in newness of life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Absolution

Almighty God, who has promised forgiveness to all who turn to him in faith:

pardon you and set you free from all your sins, strengthen you in all goodness and keep you in eternal life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Please stand as the choir sing: Gloria in Excelsis

Glory to God in the highest, and peace to God's people on earth.

Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory.

Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit in the glory of God the Father. Amen

The Collect

Almighty God, whose apostles Peter and Paul glorified you in their deaths as in their lives: grant that your Church, inspired by their teaching and example, and knit together in unity by your Spirit, may ever stand firm upon the one foundation, your Son Jesus Christ our Lord; who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Please sit for the first reading: 1 Peter 2: 4 - 10 (Read by Joe Thorp)

Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. For it stands in scripture: 'See, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious; and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame.' To you then who believe, he is precious; but for those who do not believe, 'The stone that the builders rejected has become the very head of the corner', and 'A stone that makes them stumble, and a rock that makes them fall.' They stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do.

But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvellous light. Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.

Hear the word of the Lord, **thanks be to God.**

The Choir sings the Psalm: Ps 34.1-10

I will bless the Lord continually: his praise shall be always in my mouth.

Let my soul boast of the Lord: the humble shall hear it and rejoice.

O praise the Lord with me: let us exalt his name together.

For I sought the Lord's help and he answered: and he freed me from all my fears.

Look towards him and be bright with joy: your faces shall not be ashamed.

Here is a wretch who cried, and the Lord heard me: and saved me from all my troubles.

The angel of the Lord encamps round those who fear him:

and delivers them in their need.

O taste and see that the Lord is good: happy are they that hide in him!

Fear the Lord, all you his holy ones: for those who fear him never lack.

Lions may suffer want and go hungry: but those who seek the Lord lack nothing good.

The intercessor concludes:

Accept our prayers through Jesus Christ our Lord, who taught us to pray



Remain Standing



Cathedral closed/Office open: Despite the Cathedral being closed during much of July, the Cathedral Offices will be open as normal. Weekday services continue in the (heated) CP Hall and a prayer space will be open in the hall on weekdays. Follow the progress of work on ENews and our Facebook Page.

Plaster repairs: During July more work will be done on patching and repairing the render/plaster at high levels inside the Cathedral. This follows earlier careful cleaning of gutters and down-pipes, thus hopefully eliminating some of the worst leaks causing the plaster problems. Thank you to Janny Spilsbury Schakel and her Cathedral Conservation Committee. The next Cathedral Conservation project is to investigate putting in crane access off Pennington Terrace – which will likely include wheelchair access to the Memorial Garden.
