Welcome: Today's Collect (the theme prayer that draws together ideas from the various readings) includes some beautiful ideas about God and God's people. It is inspired by the parable of the lost sheep where God is portrayed as the shepherd who cares enough to go and find that one single lost sheep – and then brings it home with great rejoicing. St Paul totally understood what it meant to be a 'lost sheep' and to be overawed by the love of God for him. His letters both to Timothy (am) and the Colossians (pm) reflect his longing for all the 'lost sheep' of the world to come home to God. For Paul that meant knowing Jesus Christ as Lord and Saviour and living a life worthy of the name Christian - a follower of Christ. Every time we witness, or participate in, a baptism, we hear the invitation to turn to Christ and be touched again with grateful wonder at the tenderness of (God's) forbearing love. Welcome to all who worship the Good Shepherd today.

I am grateful to Christ Jesus our Lord, who has strengthened me, because he judged me faithful and appointed me to his service, even though I was formerly a blasphemer, a persecutor, and a man of violence. We give you thanks that through the waters of the Red Sea you led your people out of slavery into freedom, and brought them through the river Jordan to new life in the land of promise. **Thanks be to God.**

We give you thanks for your Son Jesus Christ: for his baptism by John, for his anointing with the Holy Spirit. **Thanks be to God.**

We give you thanks that through the deep waters of death Jesus delivered us from our sins and was raised to new life in triumph. **Thanks be to God.** We give you thanks for the grace of the Holy Spirit who forms us in the likeness of Christ and leads us to proclaim your kingdom. **Thanks be to God.**

And now we give you thanks that you have called Arthur and Roland to new birth in your Church through the waters of baptism.

Pour out your Holy Spirit in blessing and sanctify this water so that those who are baptised in it may be made one with Christ in his death and resurrection.

May they die to sin, rise to newness of life, and continue forever in Jesus Christ our Lord, through whom we give you praise and honour in the unity of the Spirit, now and for ever. **Amen**.

I now ask you to affirm as yours the faith of the Church.

Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in God the Son?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen. This is the faith of the Church.

All respond:

This is our faith: We believe in one God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

The candidates are brought to the water


