A key feature of Ignatian Spirituality is the practice of 'examen'. Usually this means time set aside at the end of the day to reflect on the day – what has been done, what has not been done, and what still needs to be done. It's a sort of stock-take of one's life. During the month of February Archbishop Geoff has asked all parishes and ministry units to do this sort of exercise. The particular tool we are using is a Church Survey produced for the Diocese of Adelaide by NCLS Research <u>www.ncls.org.au</u>

In the course of each of today's services ten minutes will be set aside so that each person attending worship can make a start on completing their individual survey form (with separate forms for those aged 8 – 14). It is likely you will need more than the allocated ten minutes so please continue with the work immediately after the service. 

Please sit for the first reading: Sirach 15:14-20 (read by Ben Begg)

It was he who created humankind in the beginning, and he left them in the power of their own free choice.¹⁵ If you choose, you can keep the commandments, and to act faithfully is a matter of your own choice. ¹⁶ He has placed before you fire and water; stretch out your hand for whichever you choose. ¹⁷ Before each person are life and death, and whichever one chooses will be given. ¹⁸ For great is the wisdom of the Lord; he is mighty in power and sees everything; ¹⁹ his eyes are on those who fear him, and he knows every human action. ²⁰ He has not commanded anyone to be wicked, and he has not given anyone permission to sin.

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew

Jesus said: 'You have heard that it was said to those of ancient times, "You shall not murder"; and "whoever murders shall be liable to judgement." ²² But I say to you that if you are angry with a brother or sister, you will be liable to judgement; and if you insult a brother or sister, you will be liable to the council; and if you say, "You fool", you will be liable to the hell of fire. ²³ So when you are offering your gift at the altar,

if you remember that your brother or sister has something against you, ²⁴ leave your gift there before the altar and go; first be reconciled to your brother or sister, and then come and offer your gift. ²⁵ Come to terms quickly with your accuser while you are on the way to court with him, or your accuser may hand you over to the judge, and the judge to the guard, and you will be thrown into prison. ²⁶ Truly I tell you, you will never get out until you have paid the last penny. ²⁷ 'You have heard that it was said, "You shall not commit adultery." ²⁸ But I say to you that everyone who looks at a woman with lust has already committed adultery with her in his heart. ²⁹ If your right eye causes you to sin, tear it out and throw it away; it is better for you to lose one of your members than for your whole body to be thrown into hell. ³⁰ And if your right hand causes you to sin, cut it off and throw it away; it is better for you to lose one of your members than for your whole body to go into hell. ³¹ 'It was also said, "Whoever divorces his wife, let him give her a certificate of divorce." ³² But I say to you that anyone who divorces his wife, except on the ground of unchastity, causes her to commit adultery; and whoever marries a divorced woman commits adultery. ³³ 'Again, you have heard that it was said to those of ancient times, "You shall not swear falsely, but carry out the vows you have made to the Lord." ³⁴ But I say to you, Do not swear at all, either by heaven, for it is the throne of God, ³⁵ or by the earth, for it is his footstool, or by Jerusalem, for it is the city of the great King. ³⁶ And do not swear by your head, for you cannot make one hair white or black. ³⁷ Let your word be "Yes, Yes" or "No, No"; anything more than this comes from the evil one.






Let us proclaim the mystery of faith:

If you do not wish to receive Holy Communion, you may like to come forward and receive a blessing (simply bow your head as a signal). It is acceptable to receive only the bread. Gluten free bread is available; please ask for this from the priest giving communion. During the administration of Holy Communion the Choir sings the Motet: Ola Gjeilo (b. 1978) – Ubi caritas
