Welcome to this service of reflective prayer. The words and songs of this service move in and out of an underlying silence. There will be a period of silence suggested between sections of the service. We are seated throughout the liturgy in order to maintain a sense of stillness in the midst of the relentless activity of our lives. This service has been adapted for our period of isolation.

Introduction

This weekend we are reflecting on one of the very significant "I am" statements of Jesus; "I am the Good Shepherd". The reading tonight speaks of the enormous sacrifice Jesus chose to make because of his undying love for us, individually and communally and his promise to remain close to us.

When we think about a shepherd, we think about one who watches over, looks after, guides and protects the sheep entrusted to the shepherd's care.

In this challenging time of a viral pandemic, we are never alone. The Good Shepherd is with us, watching over us, calling us to stay close to him. He is willing and wanting to guide scientists, doctors, nurses, our nation's leaders, economists and advisors, and indeed every one of us. We need only to be open to listening to his voice and trusting in his power to protect us now and for whatever lies ahead.

There are many uncertainties concerning the future. Many people are experiencing, in their own way, times of anxiety, depression, or a sense of hopelessness. This is quite normal in such a time of upheaval, loss and insecurity.

Yet if we can abandon our hearts minds and souls into the loving care, guidance and protection of the Good Shepherd, we will find a love stronger than our fear, a hope stronger than our despair and a steadfast confidence that, as in the words of Julian of Norwich, "All shall be well, and all shall be well, and all manner of things shall be well."

Reading Gospel of St. John 10:11-18 (NIV)

¹¹ "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. ¹² The hired hand is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep. So when he sees the wolf coming, he abandons the sheep and runs away. Then the wolf attacks the flock and scatters it. ¹³ The man runs away because he is a hired hand and cares nothing for the sheep. ¹⁴ "I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep and my sheep know me – ¹⁵ just as the Father knows me and I know the Father – and I lay down my life for the sheep. ¹⁶ I have other sheep that are not of this sheep pen. I must bring them also. They too will listen to my voice, and there shall be one flock and one shepherd. ¹⁷ The reason my Father loves me is that I lay down my life – only to take it up again. ¹⁸ No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have authority to lay it down and authority to take it up again. This command I received from my Father."
