# 6:00pm 12 July 2020 The Fifth Sunday after Trinity

Welcome: Along with toilet paper and pasta apparently there has also been a rush over the past few months on seeds and seedlings. It seems that many people have had plenty of time to spend in their gardens. As a man who wandered round the countryside with his friends Jesus was obviously a keen observer of what happened around him. One of his best known parables is that of the Sower recorded in today's Gospel reading.

Today, the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of July, is widely regarded as Sea Sunday. It is an opportunity to remember the ministry of the Church, particularly through organisations such as the Mission to Seafarers, and the very lonely lives many seafarers endure – separated for long months from home and family. Inspired by Psalm 107 William Whiting wrote the words of tonight's final hymn beginning 'Eternal Father strong to save ... for those in peril on the sea.' Countless mariners have belted the words out to the stirring tune *Melita* written by another Anglican priest John Dykes.

Welcome to all as we gather to worship God, who is Lord of both land and sea.

Dearly beloved, the Scripture moveth us in sundry places to acknowledge and confess our manifold sins and wickedness; and that we should not dissemble nor cloke them before the face of Almighty God our heavenly Father; but confess them with a humble, lowly, penitent, and obedient heart; to the end that we may obtain forgiveness of the same, by his infinite goodness and mercy. And although we ought at all times humbly to acknowledge our sins before God; yet ought we most chiefly so to do, when we assemble and meet together to render thanks for the great benefits that we have received at his hands, to set forth his most worthy praise, to hear his most holy Word, and to ask those things which are requisite and necessary, as well for the body as the soul. Wherefore I pray and beseech you, as many as are here present, to accompany me with a pure heart, and humble voice, unto the throne of the heavenly grace, saying after me:

Almighty and most merciful Father, We have erred and strayed from thy ways like lost sheep, We have followed too much the devices and desires of our own hearts, We have offended against thy holy laws, We have left undone those things which we ought to have done, And we have done those things which we ought not to have done, And there is no health in us: But thou, O Lord, have mercy upon us miserable offenders; Spare thou them, O God, which confess their faults, Restore thou them that are penitent, According to thy promises declared unto mankind in Christ Jesu our Lord: And grant, O most merciful Father, for his sake, That we may hereafter live a godly, righteous, and sober life, To the glory of thy holy Name. Amen.

#### Absolution

Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who desireth not the death of a sinner, but rather that they may turn from their wickedness, and live; and hath given power and commandment to his Ministers, to declare and pronounce to his people, being penitent, the Absolution and Remission of their sins: He pardoneth and absolveth all them that truly repent and unfeignedly believe his holy Gospel. Please sit for the first reading: Genesis 26:1-6, 23-25 (read by The Rev'd Peter Jin)

Now there was a famine in the land, besides the former famine that had occurred in the days of Abraham. And Isaac went to Gerar, to King Abimelech of the Philistines. <sup>2</sup> The Lord appeared to Isaac and said, 'Do not go down to Egypt; settle in the land that I shall show you. <sup>3</sup> Reside in this land as an alien, and I will be with you, and will bless you; for to you and to your descendants I will give all these lands, and I will fulfil the oath that I swore to your father Abraham. <sup>4</sup> I will make your offspring as numerous as the stars of heaven, and will give to your offspring all these lands; and all the nations of the earth shall gain blessing for themselves through your offspring, <sup>5</sup> because Abraham obeyed my voice and kept my charge, my commandments, my statutes, and my laws.' <sup>6</sup> So Isaac settled in Gerar. <sup>23</sup> From there he went up to Beer-sheba. <sup>24</sup> And that very night the Lord appeared to him and said, 'I am the God of your father Abraham; do not be afraid, for I am with you and will bless you and make your offspring numerous for my servant Abraham's sake.' <sup>25</sup> So he built an altar there, called on the name of the Lord , and pitched his tent there. And there Isaac's servants dug a well.

Please sit for the second reading: Romans 9:15-26 (read by Gregory Crawford) For he says to Moses,

'I will have mercy on whom I have mercy, and I will have compassion on whom I have compassion.'

- <sup>16</sup> So it depends not on human will or exertion, but on God who shows mercy.
- <sup>17</sup> For the scripture says to Pharaoh, 'I have raised you up for the very purpose of showing my power in you, so that my name may be proclaimed in all the earth.' <sup>18</sup> So then he has mercy on whomsoever he chooses, and he hardens the heart of whomsoever he chooses.
- <sup>19</sup> You will say to me then, 'Why then does he still find fault? For who can resist his will?' <sup>20</sup> But who indeed are you, a human being, to argue with God? Will what is moulded say to the one who moulds it, 'Why have you made me like this?' <sup>21</sup> Has the potter no right over the clay, to make out of the same lump one object for special use and another for ordinary use? <sup>22</sup> What if God, desiring to show his wrath and to make known his power, has endured with much patience the objects of wrath that are made for destruction; <sup>23</sup> and what if he has done so in order to make known the riches of his glory for the objects of mercy, which he has prepared beforehand for glory <sup>24</sup> including us whom he has called, not from the Jews only but also from the Gentiles? <sup>25</sup> As indeed he says in Hosea,

'Those who were not my people I will call "my people", and her who was not beloved I will call "beloved".'

<sup>26</sup> 'And in the very place where it was said to them, "You are not my people", there they shall be called children of the living God.'
