Welcome: "I am convinced that ... nothing in all creation will be able to separate us from the love of God in Jesus Christ." At the end of eight long chapters of densely woven theological argument St Paul makes this incredible statement in the Epistle to the Romans. It's a statement born out of his understanding of scripture and the ongoing story of God's relationship with people. But the real genius of Paul is that he recognizes so clearly that this relationship is not something that is confined to just a few people. Like the sower who scatters seed widely regardless of the type of soil, Paul understands God's love goes way beyond any other sort of human experience.

And, continues St Paul in Romans 10, the privilege and task of the church, all those who have been baptized into Christ, is to make this love known, to be the bringers of good news, of Gospel. How our world needs to hear this simple and utterly profound message now! Nothing can separate us from the love of God.

As we gather for worship today, we do so knowing we are embraced in the love of God. Welcome one and all.

The Collect

Please sit for the first reading: Genesis 29:15-28 (read by Don Morris)

After Jacob had stayed with him for a whole month, ¹⁵ Laban said to him, 'Why should you work for me for nothing simply because you are my kinsman? Tell me what wage you would settle for.' ¹⁶ Now Laban had two daughters: the elder was called Leah, and the younger Rachel. ¹⁷ Leah was dulleyed, but Rachel was beautiful in both face and figure, and ¹⁸ Jacob had fallen in love with her. He said, 'For your younger daughter Rachel I would work seven years.' ¹⁹ Laban replied, 'It is better that I should give her to you than to anyone else; stay with me.'

²⁰ When Jacob had worked seven years for Rachel, and they seemed like a few days because he loved her, ²¹ he said to Laban, 'I have served my time. Give me my wife that I may lie with her.' ²² Laban brought all the people of the place together and held a wedding feast. ²³ In the evening he took his daughter Leah and brought her to Jacob, and he lay with her. ²⁴ At the same time Laban gave his slave-girl Zilpah to his daughter Leah. ²⁵ But when morning came, there was Leah! Jacob said to Laban, 'What is this you have done to me? It was for Rachel I worked. Why have you played this trick on me?'

²⁶ Laban answered, 'It is against the custom of our country to marry off the younger sister before the elder. ²⁷ Go through with the seven days' feast for the elder, and the younger shall be given you in return for a further seven years' work.' ²⁸ Jacob agreed, and completed the seven days for Leah. Then Laban gave Jacob his daughter Rachel to be his wife.

Hear the word of the Lord, thanks be to God.

Psalm 128

Blessed is everyone who fears the Lord: and walks in the confine of his ways.

You will eat the fruit of your labours:

happy shall you be, and all shall go well with you.

Your wife within your house: shall be as a fruitful vine;

Your children around your table: like the fresh shoots of the olive.

Behold, thus shall the man be blessed: who lives in the fear of the Lord.

May the Lord so bless you from Zion:

that you see Jerusalem in prosperity all the days of your life.

May you see your children's children: and in Israel let there be peace.

Second reading: Romans 8:26-39 (read by Daryl Farnham)

Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. ²⁷ And God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God.

- ²⁸ We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose. ²⁹ For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn within a large family. ³⁰ And those whom he predestined he also called; and those whom he called he also justified; and those whom he justified he also glorified.
- What then are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? He who did not withhold his own Son, but gave him up for all of us, will he not with him also give us everything else? 33 Who will bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. 34 Who is to condemn? It is Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us.
- ³⁵ Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? ³⁶ As it is written,

'For your sake we are being killed all day long; we are accounted as sheep to be slaughtered.'

- ³⁷ No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us.
- ³⁸ For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, ³⁹ nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Please stand for the Gospel

The Holy Gospel is written in the thirteenth Chapter of the Gospel according to Matthew, beginning at the forty-fourth verse.

Glory be to thee, O Lord

Jesus said: 'The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field, which someone found and hid; then in his joy he goes and sells all that he has and buys that field.

- ⁴⁵ 'Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant in search of fine pearls; ⁴⁶ on finding one pearl of great value, he went and sold all that he had and bought it.
- ⁴⁷ 'Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a net that was thrown into the sea and caught fish of every kind; ⁴⁸ when it was full, they drew it ashore, sat down, and put the good into baskets but threw out the bad. ⁴⁹ So it will be at the end of the age. The angels will come out and separate the evil from the righteous ⁵⁰ and throw them into the furnace of fire, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.
- ⁵¹ 'Have you understood all this?' They answered, 'Yes.' ⁵² And he said to them, 'Therefore every scribe who has been trained for the kingdom of heaven is like the master of a household who brings out of his treasure what is new and what is old.' ⁵³ When Jesus had finished these parables, he left that place.
- ⁵⁴ He came to his home town and began to teach the people in their synagogue, so that they were astounded and said, 'Where did this man get this wisdom and these deeds of power? ⁵⁵ Is not this the carpenter's son? Is not his mother called Mary? And are not his brothers James and Joseph and Simon and Judas? ⁵⁶ And are not all his sisters with us? Where then did this man get all this?' ⁵⁷ And they took offence at him. But Jesus said to them, 'Prophets are not without honour except in their own country and in their own house.' ⁵⁸ And he did not do many deeds of power there, because of their unbelief.

Who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took Bread; and when he had given thanks, he brake it, and gave it to his disciples, saying,

Take, eat, this is my body which is given for you: do this in remembrance of me.

Likewise after supper he took the Cup; and, when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying,

Drink ye all of this, for this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the remission of sins: do this, as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of me.

Wherefore, O Lord and heavenly Father, we thy humble servants, having in remembrance the precious death and passion of thy dear Son, his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension, according to his holy institution, entirely desire thy fatherly goodness mercifully to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving; most humbly beseeching thee to grant, that by the merits and death of thy Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in his blood, we and all thy whole Church may obtain remission of our sins, and all other benefits of his passion.

And here we offer and present unto thee, O Lord, ourselves, our souls and bodies, to be a reasonable, holy, and lively sacrifice unto thee; humbly beseeching thee, that all we, who are partakers of this Holy Communion, may be fulfilled with thy grace and heavenly benediction.

And although we be unworthy, through our manifold sins, to offer unto thee any sacrifice, yet we beseech thee to accept this our bounden duty and service; not weighing our merits, but pardoning our offences,

Through Jesus Christ our Lord; by whom, and with whom, in the unity of the Holy Ghost, all honour and glory be unto thee, O Father Almighty, world without end. **Amen.**
