We believe in one God, the Father, the almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.





Come let us take this holy sacrament of the body and blood of Christ in remembrance that he died for us, and feed on him in our hearts by faith with thanksgiving.

Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world, have mercy upon us. (*x*2) Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, grant us your peace.

Baptised and communicant Christians of all denominations are welcome to receive Holy Communion (bread only), administered at the nave platform.

If you do not wish to receive Holy Communion, you may like to come forward and receive a blessing (simply bow your head as a signal).

Gluten free bread is available; please ask for this from the priest giving communion.
