Welcome: St Paul speaks of "walking by faith, not by sight". In short, we believe in God even though we cannot see God.

I am reminded of the time I was walking through the St Giles' Fair in Oxford. One of the local churches had set up a stall designed to encourage people to think about God, faith, and our Lord Jesus Christ. Three teenage boys were quite naughty, and they were putting this unsuspecting young man to the test. He was asked whether he could prove the existence of God, with scripture. Unfortunately, the young man said yes, but there was no satisfactory example.

When Paul says that we "walk by faith, not by sight" he is teaching that we cannot prove the existence of God. We believe in God because of our faith in God, not because we have seen God. Scripture, rather than being proof of God's existence, is a guide to how we and God communicate. Scripture reveals how God loves each one of us. It does not prove God's existence. Happily, nor can it be proven that God does not exist. We believe and we live by faith.

Amen.

These are the ones on the path where the word is sown: when they hear, Satan immediately comes and takes away the word that is sown in them. And these are the ones sown on rocky ground: when they hear the word, they immediately receive it with joy. But they have no root, and endure only for a while; then, when trouble or persecution arises on account of the word, immediately they fall away. And others are those sown among the thorns: these are the ones who hear the word, but the cares of the world, and the lure of wealth, and the desire for other things come in and choke the word, and it yields nothing. And these are the ones sown on the good soil: they hear the word and accept it and bear fruit, thirty and sixty and a hundredfold.'

He said to them, 'Is a lamp brought in to be put under the bushel basket, or under the bed, and not on the lampstand? For there is nothing hidden, except to be disclosed; nor is anything secret, except to come to light. Let anyone with ears to hear listen!'
