Welcome: Today we celebrate the life and witness of St Peter, Apostle and Martyr. Peter is very prominent in the gospels and in the Book of Acts. He is attributed with the writing of two letters in the Bible, and he appears at every major event in our Lord's Ministry. Peter presents as the leader of the disciples and is remembered for denying Jesus three times on the night of his arrest.

Peter was promised the Keys to Heaven, and that he would be the rock upon which our Lord would build his church. With his shortcomings and failures, he becomes the subject for forgiveness and reinstatement. He denied Jesus three times and he is reinstated three times. When our Lord called Peter, he promised him that he would become a fisher of men, and that the call to follow Jesus would take him to a place he did not wish to go. His ministry is extensive and well recognised. It is also well recognised that the place Peter would be taken is to that of crucifixion. In his martyrdom Peter witnessed to our Lord. His witness was they he was unworthy to be crucified in the same manner as our lord and requested that he be crucified upside down. Today and every day we thank God for the life, work, and witness, of St Peter.

After he saw that it pleased the Jews, he proceeded to arrest Peter also. (This was during the festival of Unleavened Bread.) When he had seized him, he put him in prison and handed him over to four squads of soldiers to guard him, intending to bring him out to the people

after the Passover. While Peter was kept in prison, the church prayed fervently to God for him.

The very night before Herod was going to bring him out, Peter, bound with two chains, was sleeping between two soldiers, while guards in front of the door were keeping watch over the prison. Suddenly an angel of the Lord appeared and a light shone in the cell. He tapped Peter on the side and woke him, saying, 'Get up quickly.' And the chains fell off his wrists. The angel said to him, 'Fasten your belt and put on your sandals.' He did so. Then he said to him, 'Wrap your cloak around you and follow me.' Peter went out and followed him; he did not realize that what was happening with the angel's help was real; he thought he was seeing a vision. After they had passed the first and the second guard, they came before the iron gate leading into the city. It opened for them of its own accord, and they went outside and walked along a lane, when suddenly the angel left him. Then Peter came to himself and said, 'Now I am sure that the Lord has sent his angel and rescued me from the hands of Herod and from all that the Jewish people were expecting.'






