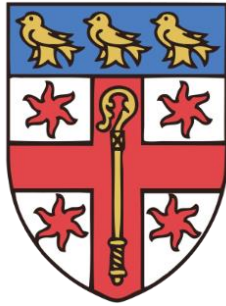

The Presentation

Representatives from St Margaret's Woodville and the Diocese will come forward to present the Dean-elect to the Archbishop, saying:

Archbishop Geoffrey, we bring you greetings. We present to you this our brother in Christ, the Right Reverend Chris McLeod, with love and gratitude for his ministry in Woodville and across the Diocese, and confidence in his selection to be the next Dean of St Peter's Cathedral.

The Archbishop responds:

Thank you for the support and care that have enabled Chris to grow in ministry. May God enable our continued support for Chris as he comes to minister in this Cathedral and Diocese.

The Cathedral Wardens, standing with the Dean-elect, join together in saying:

Archbishop Geoffrey, we come to welcome the Right Rev'd Chris McLeod who has been chosen to serve as Dean of St Peter's Cathedral. We believe that he is well qualified, and that he has been prayerfully and lawfully appointed.

The Archbishop addresses the Dean-elect, saying:

This Cathedral Church is not only the church of a parish, but also the Mother Church of the Diocese. It is the Bishop's church, and it symbolises the unity of the people of God with their Bishop in Christ.

It is a place where prayer and praise are daily offered to God. It is a place where the liturgy is celebrated with the beauty and dignity of music and ceremony. It is a place where faith is taught and the Gospel proclaimed. It is a place where the life of the state, the city and the Church is gathered and offered to God. It is a place where the visitor, the lonely, the dispirited may find spiritual refreshment, encouragement and peace. It is a place where Christians find the vision and strength to enable them by God's grace to fulfil their mission in the world.

The Dean of the Cathedral has an opportunity and responsibility of leadership in the ministry of the Cathedral in the Diocese and the community.

Chris, in the presence of this congregation, do you commit yourself to this new trust and responsibility?

Dean-elect: I do, the Lord being my helper.

The Archbishop invites the people to stand, and says:

Will you, who witness this new beginning, support and uphold Chris in this new ministry?

All: **We will.**

The Archbishop says:

Let us then offer our prayer to God for this congregation and for Chris, the Dean-elect.

The Archdeacon leads the following prayer:

GOD of gentle strength and unceasing care,
we thank you for the church in this place.
Strengthen and sustain Chris
that he may love and care for your people here.
Grant that together they may follow our Lord Jesus Christ,
offering to you their gifts and talents,
as they seek to serve you in your world,
through the same, Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

The Commissioning for Ministry

All sit. Led by the Virger, parishioners of the Cathedral presenting symbols of ministry process through the nave and gather with the Archbishop, Archdeacon, and the Dean-elect in view of the congregation.

The response of the people is intended particularly for parishioners, but all present are invited to renew their commitment to Christ and the ministry of the Church.

The Archbishop says:

All members of the church are called by Christ to share in its ministry. As members of the body of Christ we each have distinctive gifts to offer. At his ordination, Chris received the call of Christ to priestly leadership among the people of God. Let us now celebrate the ministry of priest and people together.

Archdeacon: Take this Bible. Always be faithful in reading, studying and meditating upon the word of God, diligent in proclaiming it and in encouraging the study of it.

Dean-elect: I give thanks to God for this privilege and accept this ministry.

People: **We promise to hear, read and study the word of God.**

Archdeacon: This Prayer Book is a sign that you are among us as a person of prayer. Be faithful in ordering the worship of God's people, and in the life of prayer.

Dean-elect: I commit myself to this ministry, and thank God for it.

People: **We promise to give ourselves to God in prayer and worship.**

Archdeacon: Take this Water. Be faithful in administering the sacrament of Baptism according to the command of Christ.

Dean-elect: I commit myself to this ministry, and thank God for it.

People: **We will welcome those baptised and assist them by our example and fellowship.**

Archdeacon: Take this Bread and Wine as a sign that you are among us as one who proclaims the death of Christ until he comes. Be faithful in presiding at the Lord's Table, that God's people may feed on Christ.

Dean-elect: I commit myself to this ministry, and thank God for it.

People: **May God enable us to grow together as one body in Christ.**

Archdeacon: Take this Stole as a reminder to exercise your ordination commission to proclaim the Gospel of reconciliation.

Dean-elect: I give thanks for this privilege and seek God's guidance in exercising this ministry.

People: **We recognise our need for forgiveness and seek grace to be reconciled to God.**

Archdeacon: Take this Holy Oil. Be among us as an instrument of God's healing love.

Dean-elect: I give thanks for this privilege and seek God's guidance in exercising this ministry.

People: **We will pray for the sick and suffering and for those who need the healing power of God.**

Archdeacon: Take this Cope as a symbol of your role as Dean. Love this congregation, this building, and all who enter its doors.

Dean-elect: I give thanks for this community and its commitment to mission, excellence in worship, and for the ongoing care and maintenance of this building.

People: **We will continue as a caring and welcoming people, loving this place and enabling its witness. We will continue to offer hospitality to the City of Adelaide, and to Witness to God's love and justice here.**

The Cathedral Wardens present the Dean-elect with the keys to the Cathedral.

The Wardens: Let us now affirm the call of Christ to serve as a priest among us.

People: **Be among us as a faithful priest and loving pastor so that together we may proclaim the Good News of Christ and with all God's faithful people obtain eternal life. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.**

The Registrar will read the Licence.

The Archbishop says:

Chris, I commission you as Dean of the Cathedral Church of St Peter and Parish Priest of the Cathedral Congregation, in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

The Archbishop will give the Dean the Licence, saying:

Chris, receive this charge, which we share in Christ, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The Installation

An organ fanfare is played, during which the Archbishop leads the Dean to his stall.

The Archbishop says:

My brother, I set you in your place among the people of this Cathedral Church of St Peter. May you be faithful, as is the One who calls you.

Let us pray.

SET your seal, Lord, on all that we have done in your name. Grant both to this your servant, Chris, and to all these people, that they may fulfil in their lives what they have promised with their lips, to the glory of your Name and the well-being of your Church; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

GOD pour upon you the abundance of his grace, and prosper all you do in his name; and the blessing of God Almighty, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, be upon you and remain with you always. **Amen.**

The Archbishop and the Dean return to the nave steps. The Archbishop presents the Dean to the congregation, saying:

My brothers and sisters, I present to you the Right Reverend Christopher McLeod, Dean of the Cathedral Church of St Peter.

The people shall greet the Dean with applause.

Remain seated. Her Excellency the Honourable Frances Adamson AC, Governor of South Australia, reads:

The First Lesson

A reading from the book of the Prophet Isaiah.

WHO has measured the waters in the hollow of his hand and marked off the heavens with a span, enclosed the dust of the earth in a measure, and weighed the mountains in scales and the hills in a balance? Who has directed the spirit of the Lord, or as his counselor has instructed him? Whom did he consult for his enlightenment, and who taught him the path of justice? Who taught him knowledge, and showed him the way of understanding? Even the nations are like a drop from a bucket, and are accounted as dust on the scales; see, he takes up the isles like fine dust. Lebanon would not provide fuel enough, nor are its animals enough for a burnt offering. All the nations are as nothing before him; they are accounted by him as less than nothing and emptiness. To whom then will you liken God, or what likeness compare with him? An idol? A workman casts it, and a goldsmith overlays it with gold, and casts for it silver chains. As a gift one chooses mulberry wood - wood that will not rot - then seeks out a skilled artisan to set up an image that will not topple. Have you not known? Have you not heard? Has it not been told you from the beginning? Have you not understood from the foundations of the earth? It is he who sits above the circle of the earth, and its inhabitants are like grasshoppers; who stretches out the heavens like a curtain, and spreads them like a tent to live in; who brings princes to naught, and makes the rulers of the earth as nothing. Scarcely are they planted, scarcely sown, scarcely has their stem taken root in the earth, when he blows upon them, and they wither, and the tempest carries them off like stubble. To whom then will you compare me, or who is my equal? says the Holy One. Lift up your eyes on high and see: Who created these? He who brings out their host and numbers them, calling them all by name; because he is great in strength, mighty in power, not one is missing.

Here ends the first lesson.

All stand. The Choir sings:

Magnificat

During which the Dean censes the High Altar.

MY SOUL doth magnify the Lord: and my spirit hath rejoiced in God my Saviour. For he hath regarded: the lowliness of his hand-maiden. For behold, from henceforth: all generations shall call me blessed. For he that is mighty hath magnified me: and holy is his name. And his mercy is on them that fear him: throughout all generations. He hath shewed strength with his arm: he hath scattered the proud in the imagination of their hearts. He hath put down the mighty from their seat: and hath exalted the humble and meek. He hath filled the hungry with good things: and the rich he hath sent empty away. He remembering his mercy hath holpen his servant Israel: as he promised to our forefathers, Abraham and his seed, for ever. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son: and to the Holy Ghost; as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be: world without end. Amen.

All sit. Mrs Susan McLeod reads:

The Second Lesson

A reading from the Letter to the Hebrews.

AND what more should I say? For time would fail me to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the prophets - who through faith conquered kingdoms, administered justice, obtained promises, shut the mouths of lions, quenched raging fire, escaped the edge of the sword, won strength out of weakness, became mighty in war, put foreign armies to flight. Women received their dead by resurrection. Others were tortured, refusing to accept release, in order to obtain a better resurrection. Others suffered mocking and flogging, and even chains and imprisonment. They were stoned to death, they were sawn in two, they were killed by the sword; they went about in skins of sheep and goats, destitute, persecuted, tormented - of whom the world was not worthy. They wandered in deserts and mountains, and in caves and holes in the ground.

Yet all these, though they were commended for their faith, did not receive what was promised, since God had provided something better so that they would not, apart from us, be made perfect.

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God.

Here ends the second lesson.
