### **Choral Eucharist with Holy Baptism**

# The Second Sunday in Advent 10:30am 5 December 2021

#### Welcome:

Welcome to our time of worship together. Today is the Second Sunday of Advent and we will light the next candle on the Advent wreath. Variously known as the 'Bethlehem Candle' or the 'Candle of Faith', it reminds us that Mary and Joseph travelled to Bethlehem and that angels had spoken to them asking that they accept on faith a promise of cosmic enormity. There, by such faith, they encountered God in a way that was beyond any mortal expectation. It is a very human thing to create a god of our own expectation, yet time and again through the Bible we see that God proclaimed himself beyond the limits of any such expectation and, by so doing, demanded a faith which was prepared to break free of the chains of all prior human prediction.

Despite all the prophecies recorded in the Old Testament, summarised in the Song of Zechariah which we will hear this morning from our choir, it would be, as our Gospel reading this morning will tell us, a 'voice of one crying out in the wilderness' who would be needed to remind people of those prophecies.

Mary and Joseph were the first to witness the fulfilment of Malachi's words: 'the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple' when Jesus was born in a humble manger, our annual journey to Christmas celebrations is a time to refocus our thinking on what remembrance of his birth should mean for us.



In the fifteenth year of the reign of Emperor Tiberius, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was ruler of Galilee, and his brother Philip ruler of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias ruler of Abilene, during the high-priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness.

I invite his sponsors and family to present him now.

We present Edward to be baptised.

Will you accept the responsibilities placed upon you in bringing Edward for baptism? I am.

Are you willing to answer on behalf of him? I am.

By your own prayers and example, by your friendship and love,

will you encourage him in the life and faith of the Christian community?

I will, with God's help.

The Decision

Before God and this congregation, you, parents and sponsors of Edward, must affirm that you turn to Christ and reject all that is evil:

Do you turn to Christ? I turn to Christ.

Do you repent of your sins? I repent of my sins.

Do you reject selfish living, and all that is false and unjust? I reject them all.

Do you renounce Satan and all evil? I renounce all that is evil.

Almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness,

and lead you in the light of Christ to his everlasting kingdom. Amen.

Will you each, by God's grace, strive to live as a disciple of Christ,

loving God with your whole heart, and your neighbour as yourself,

until your life's end? I will, with God's help.

You have heard these our brothers and sisters respond to Christ.

Will you support them in this calling? We will.

Let us pray.

Grant, merciful God, that Edward may be so buried with Christ in baptism that the new nature may be raised up in him. May the fruit of your Spirit grow and flourish in him. **Amen.** 

Give to his sponsors and families the desire to share with him what you have revealed in your holy gospel. **Amen.** 

May he know Christ's forgiving love and continue in the fellowship and service of his Church. May he proclaim, by word and example, the good news of God in Christ.

#### Amen.

We thank you for the ministry we have in your world and to each other in the household of faith. Hasten that day when the whole creation shall be made perfect in Christ. **Amen.** 

The Baptism

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

We give you thanks that at the beginning of creation your Holy Spirit moved upon the waters to bring forth light and life. With water you cleanse and replenish the earth; you nourish and sustain all living things. **Thanks be to God.** 

We give you thanks that through the waters of the Red Sea you led your people out of slavery into freedom, and brought them through the river Jordan to new life in the land of promise. **Thanks be to God.** 

We give you thanks for your Son Jesus Christ: for his baptism by John, for his anointing with the Holy Spirit. **Thanks be to God.** 

We give you thanks that through the deep waters of death Jesus delivered us from our sins and was raised to new life in triumph. **Thanks be to God.** 

We give you thanks for the grace of the Holy Spirit who forms us in the likeness of Christ and leads us to proclaim your kingdom. **Thanks be to God.** 

And now we give you thanks that you have called Edward to new birth in your Church through the waters of baptism.

Pour out your Holy Spirit in blessing and sanctify this water so that he who is baptised in it may be made one with Christ in his death and resurrection. May he die to sin, rise to newness of life, and continue forever in Jesus Christ our Lord, through whom we give you praise and honour in the unity of the Spirit, now and for ever. **Amen.** 

I now ask you to affirm as yours the faith of the Church.

Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in God the Son?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

This is the faith of the Church.

This is our faith: We believe in one God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Edward is brought to the water

Edward, I baptise you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**







Let us proclaim the mystery of faith:






