(Compline) January 2022

Adapted from Celebrating Common Prayer (a Version of the Daily Office SSF) and A Prayer Book for Australia, for use in St Peter's Cathedral after Christmas.

Welcome from the Dean:

Night Prayer is a lovely service of quiet and reflection. It derives from the service of Compline. Compline traditionally occurs late in the evening and is offered by religious orders, but it is also followed by clergy and laity, especially when on retreat. Many people keep Night Prayer or Compline as part of their own daily devotions. Our service occurs a little earlier in the evening and takes the place of Evensong during the slow time of January.

During the season of Epiphany, we celebrate the revelation of God in Christ to the world. This is reflected in the story of the visit of the three wise men to Jesus (Matthew 1: 1 – 12). As we take a breath before the busyness of 2022 begins, it is good to reflect on God's revelation to the world. How has God been active in our lives in 2021, and what do we hope for in 2022? We bring these prayers to God through the comforting service of Night Prayer. In the service we are immersed in Scripture, adding to the depth of our prayerful reflections. We pick up the story of how God's revelation includes us.

I do hope you enjoy our worship this evening, and I wish you God's blessings and providence for the year ahead.
