Choral Evensong Palm Sunday

'Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!'

Welcome to St Peter's Cathedral! I wonder what the first followers of Jesus thought the result would be from his triumphant entry into Jerusalem on the very first Palm Sunday. The event was surrounded by a great sense of excitement and hopefulness. We know that it was interpreted as the entry of the long-awaited Messiah; the one who would put things right. However, the week following the first Palm Sunday did not turn out as they expected. On Good Friday all their hopes and dreams seemed to be dashed. Their long-awaited Messiah ended up dying on the Cross (but we know things did change at Easter). This mixture of joy, expectation, disappointment, and confusion is part of the Christian journey, I find. Holy Week brings that into focus as we travel with Jesus to the Cross. We do know how the story ends, however. We do know that the light of Easter casts its shadow back over the events of what we now call Holy Week and Good Friday. Nonetheless, this weeklong meditational journey into the last week of Jesus' earthly life helps us draw nearer to our crucified Lord. I do hope that you will be able to join us for some of the worship this week. There are several services listed for you to attend at the back of this service sheet. The Lord said to Moses: ² Consecrate to me all the firstborn; whatever is the first to open the womb among the Israelites, of human beings and animals, is mine. ³ Moses said to the people, 'Remember this day on which you came out of Egypt, out of the house of slavery, because the Lord brought you out from there by strength of hand; no leavened bread shall be eaten. ⁷ Unleavened bread shall be eaten for seven days; no leavened bread shall be seen in your possession, and no leaven shall be seen among you in all your territory. ⁸ You shall tell your child on that day, "It is because of what the Lord did for me when I came out of Egypt." ⁹ It shall serve for you as a sign on your hand and as a reminder on your forehead, so that the teaching of the Lord may be on your lips; for with a strong hand the Lord brought you out of Egypt.

Please sit for the second reading: John 12:20-32 (read by Kirsty Munro)

Now among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. ²¹ They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and said to him, 'Sir, we wish to see Jesus.' ²² Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. ²³ Jesus answered them, 'The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. ²⁴ Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit.

²⁵ Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life.²⁶ Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honour. ²⁷ 'Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say — "Father, save me from this hour"? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. ²⁸ Father, glorify your name.' Then a voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.' ²⁹ The crowd standing there heard it and said that it was thunder. Others said, 'An angel has spoken to him.' ³⁰ Jesus answered, 'This voice has come for your sake, not for mine. ³¹ Now is the judgement of this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. ³² And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself.'
