From last Sunday, the second Sunday Easter, we start a reading for the rest of the Easter season of the book of Revelation, both in the morning Eucharist and Evensong service.

At one point the Bible was compiled. We have all these texts that were floating around, both the Hebrew texts and the Greek texts, and at a certain point the Church canonised them. The Church put them in a particular order and it put the book of Revelation last. The way the story ends is extraordinary significant. That is why the Church now during this holiest of seasons focuses our attention on it.

The English word Revelation comes from the Latin word Revalatio. In Greek Revelation means Apokalypsis. Apocalypse literally means, unveiling.

Friends, please don't read it as the end of the physical world, the whole world falling apart, rather, we read it symbolically. Revelation is meant to unveil something. Something that was hidden is being unveiled to us. Something that every generation of Christians needs to see. To see a new world. God wants this new world to be born out of the ruins of the old world.

Please sit for the first reading: Revelation 2:1-11 (read by Henry Vaughan)

'To the angel of the church in Ephesus write: These are the words of him who holds the seven stars in his right hand, who walks among the seven golden lampstands:

'I know your works, your toil and your patient endurance. I know that you cannot tolerate evildoers; you have tested those who claim to be apostles but are not, and have found them to be false. I also know that you are enduring patiently and bearing up for the sake of my name, and that you have not grown weary. But I have this against you, that you have abandoned the love you had at first. Remember then from what you have fallen; repent, and do the works you did at first. If not, I will come to you and remove your lampstand from its place, unless you repent. Yet this is to your credit: you hate the works of the Nicolaitans, which I also hate. Let anyone who has an ear listen to what the Spirit is saying to the churches. To everyone who conquers, I will give permission to eat from the tree of life that is in the paradise of God.

'And to the angel of the church in Smyrna write: These are the words of the first and the last, who was dead and came to life:

'I know your affliction and your poverty, even though you are rich. I know the slander on the part of those who say that they are Jews and are not, but are a synagogue of Satan. Do not fear what you are about to suffer. Beware, the devil is about to throw some of you into prison so that you may be tested, and for ten days you will have affliction. Be faithful until death, and I will give you the crown of life. Let anyone who has an ear listen to what the Spirit is saying to the churches. Whoever conquers will not be harmed by the second death.

Please sit for the second reading: Acts 9:22-31 (read by Chris Goodes)

Saul became increasingly more powerful and confounded the Jews who lived in Damascus by proving that Jesus was the Messiah.

After some time had passed, the Jews plotted to kill him, but their plot became known to Saul. They were watching the gates day and night so that they might kill him; but his disciples took him by night and let him down through an opening in the wall, lowering him in a basket.

When he had come to Jerusalem, he attempted to join the disciples; and they were all afraid of him, for they did not believe that he was a disciple. But Barnabas took him, brought him to the apostles, and described for them how on the road he had seen the Lord, who had spoken to him, and how in Damascus he had spoken boldly in the name of Jesus. So he went in and out among them in Jerusalem, speaking boldly in the name of the Lord. He spoke and argued with the Hellenists; but they were attempting to kill him. When the believers learned of it, they brought him down to Caesarea and sent him off to Tarsus.

Meanwhile the church throughout Judea, Galilee, and Samaria had peace and was built up. Living in the fear of the Lord and in the comfort of the Holy Spirit, it increased in numbers.
