Welcome to our time of worship together.

Rabbinic tradition has it that the Book of Ecclesiastes was written by King Solomon towards the end of his life, at that point where he knew he would soon be called home. Our reading from that book tonight, the lines from Chapter 3 which were popularised by the Byrds in their 1965 song *Turn, turn, turn*, should be considered in the light of having been written reflectively after a long life of mountain peaks and dark valleys through which Solomon would have traversed. In other words, they should not be read in a superficial way such as captured in greeting cards with misty, artistic shots of nature on their front, but with an intent to find their deeper meaning.

To everything there is a season, and a time for every purpose under heaven

These words of Solomon from the first line should not be interpreted as either words of superficial comfort or as an expression of a fatalism of inevitability, but rather as a statement of God's love for us, affirmed through his Son (John 3:16), and of his plans for us (Jeremiah 29:11). In C14, Julian of Norwich wrote, *All shall be well, and all shall be well and all manner of thing shall be well*

In her words, she captured the essence of God's love and of His plans if we would but 'turn, turn, turn' to Him.

Now when Jesus returned, the crowd welcomed him, for they were all waiting for him. Just then there came a man named Jairus, a leader of the synagogue. He fell at Jesus' feet and begged him to come to his house, for he had an only daughter, about twelve years old, who was dying.

As he went, the crowds pressed in on him. Now there was a woman who had been suffering from haemorrhages for twelve years; and though she had spent all she had on physicians, no one could cure her. She came up behind him and touched the fringe of his clothes, and immediately her haemorrhage stopped. Then Jesus asked, 'Who touched me?' When all denied it, Peter said, 'Master, the crowds surround you and press in on you.' But Jesus said, 'Someone touched me; for I noticed that

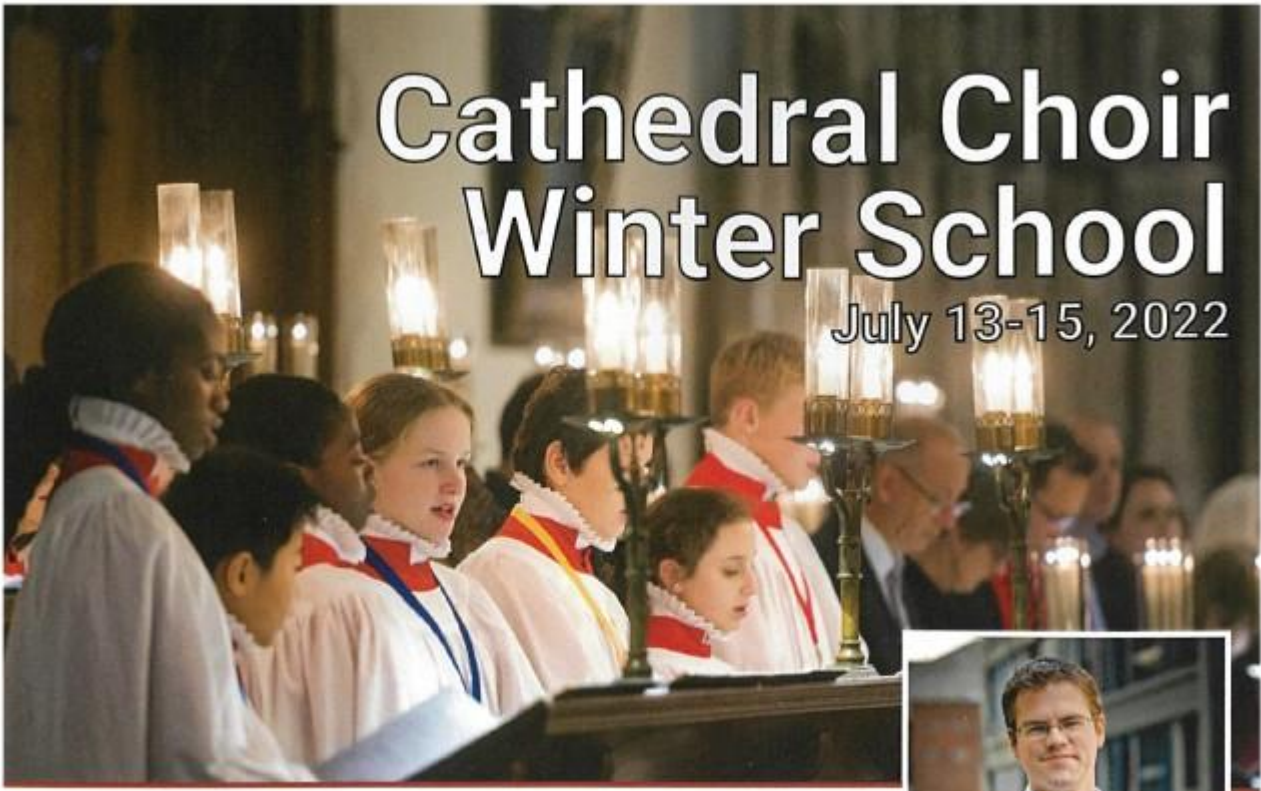
Thomas will also conduct the Choral Eucharist on Sunday 3 July.
