



Lest We Forget

Welcome to St Peter's Cathedral. We are delighted to have you worship with us today for this service of Choral Evensong from the Book of Common Prayer. As the choir and clergy lead this service, allow the music and words to bring you into a stillness and prayerful reflection with God. Please join us in saying the words in bold. The hymns can be found in the separate hymn book. Indications for sitting, kneeling, and standing are a guide only.

St Peter's Cathedral resides on the lands of the Kaurua people. We give thanks for their ancestors and acknowledge the ongoing right and responsibility of their elders to care for this Country. We are committed to work and pray towards a more just settlement for all Indigenous people and pay our respect to First Nations people with us.

St Peter's Cathedral is a Christ-centred, sacramental, inclusive, thinking, mission-oriented faith community

Poppies produce seeds that can lie dormant in the soil for as long as one hundred years. The seeds need light to grow so they only germinate in disturbed soils. The digging of trenches, the bombs, the mass cemeteries that decimated Europe's landscape during World War I brought about the blooming of millions of poppies on the disrupted soil.

And so, they are the symbol of remembrance for us, of remembering the lives of those who fell on that soil, of remembering the grief of those who loved them, of remembering the horror and waste of war. Poppies, photographs, tears and poetry, nurture our remembering of war, nurture our longing for forgiveness for it, nurture our guilt, our grief that the wars just keep on, that our need for power, our insecurity and fear, means that the wars just keep on being fought. As we gather for Choral Evensong tonight may we know that our remembering is held in the great love of God, whose way is the way of peace.

With the St Peter's Cathedral Choir and Cathedral Organ


