THE BAPTISM OF OUR LORD

SUNDAY 8TH JANUARY 2023

8AM

A warm welcome to St Peter's Cathedral as we gather for worship this morning.

St Peter's Cathedral resides on the lands of the Kurna people. We give thanks for their ancestors and acknowledge the ongoing right and responsibility of their elders to care for this Country. We are committed to work and pray towards a more just settlement for all Indigenous people and pay our respect to First Nations people with us.

St Peter's Cathedral is a Christ-centred, sacramental, inclusive, thinking, mission-oriented faith community.

By the time you read this the celebration of Christmas has passed for most of us. However, the message of Christmas lingers on in the various celebrations present within our Liturgical Calendar: The Epiphany of our Lord (The visit of the Wise Men -January 1) and then moving onto key events in the life of Jesus: The Baptism of our Lord (January 8); The Presentation of Christ in the Temple which we will celebrate at Evensong on Sunday, January 29 at 6pm and with a Eucharist on Thursday, February 2 at 7.30am. The church's celebrations continue even as we enjoy the slowness that January provides.

January offers us a time catch our breath before the real busyness of the year starts. It is a time to watch cricket, take a stroll down at the beach, meet up with friends for leisurely lunches, or just take the time to 'be'. The slowness of January provides the time to reflect on the year past and pray for the year ahead. It is a time to rejoice in God's revelation to the world in Christ and commit 2023 to God's care and guidance.

During January the Sunday worship services will be: 8am Eucharist (Book of Common Prayer), 10.30am Sung Eucharist (A Prayer Book for Australia), Night Prayer with hymns at 6.00pm. Weekday Services will be Wednesday Eucharist at 7.30am and 10 am and Friday Eucharist at 7.30am.

May you have a blessed and peaceful January.

FIRST READING

A reading from the Prophet Isaiah.

ISAIAH 42:1-9

Here is my servant, whom I uphold,
my chosen, in whom my soul delights;
I have put my spirit upon him;
he will bring forth justice to the nations.
He will not cry or lift up his voice,
or make it heard in the street;
a bruised reed he will not break,
and a dimly burning wick he will not quench;
he will faithfully bring forth justice.
He will not grow faint or be crushed
until he has established justice in the earth;
and the coastlands wait for his teaching.
Thus says God, the Lord ,
who created the heavens and stretched them out,
who spread out the earth and what comes from it,
who gives breath to the people upon it
and spirit to those who walk in it:
I am the Lord , I have called you in righteousness,
I have taken you by the hand and kept you;
I have given you as a covenant to the people,
a light to the nations,
to open the eyes that are blind,
to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon,
from the prison those who sit in darkness.
I am the Lord , that is my name;
my glory I give to no other,
nor my praise to idols.
See, the former things have come to pass,
and new things I now declare;
before they spring forth,
I tell you of them.

PSALM 29

Ascribe to the Lord, you powers of heaven: ascribe to the Lord glory and might.

The voice of the Lord is mighty in operation:

the voice of the Lord is a glorious voice.

The Lord sits enthroned above the water-flood: the Lord sits enthroned as a king for ever.

The Lord will give strength to his people:

the Lord will give to his people the blessing of peace.

SECOND READING

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

ACTS 10.34-43

Then Peter began to speak to them: 'I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ—he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name.'

The Holy Gospel is written in the 3rd Chapter of the Gospel according to Matthew, beginning at verse 13.

Glory be to thee, O Lord

MATTHEW 3.13-17

Then Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan, to be baptized by him. John would have prevented him, saying, 'I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?' But Jesus answered him, 'Let it be so now; for it is proper for us in this way to fulfil all righteousness.' Then he consented. And when Jesus had been baptized, just as he came up from the water, suddenly the heavens were opened to him and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him. And a voice from heaven said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord: **Praise be to thee, O Christ.**
