A warm welcome to St Peter's Cathedral as we gather for worship this morning.

St Peter's Cathedral resides on the lands of the Kurna people. We give thanks for their ancestors and acknowledge the ongoing right and responsibility of their elders to care for this Country. We are committed to work and pray towards a more just settlement for all Indigenous people and pay our respect to First Nations people with us.

St Peter's Cathedral is a Christ-centred, sacramental, inclusive, thinking, mission-oriented faith community.

Today is the 4th Sunday in Lent and is known by two different names. The first is Mothering Sunday and is a reflection on the love a mother, or father, has for their children. We are reminded that even though this is a great love, God's love for us is even greater. The other name for this Sunday is Laetare, or Refreshment, Sunday, as it marks the half way point through Lent. This day can be used to have a break from Lenten fasting, so that we have then have the fortitude to continue through to Easter! Simnel cake is traditionally eaten on this day. It is a rich dense fruit cake with marzipan layers and originates from medieval Britain. Thank you to those members of the congregation that baked these this year's Simnel cakes. Please enjoy some after the service.

The Holy Gospel is written in the 2nd Chapter of the Gospel according to Luke beginning at verse 40.

Glory be to thee, O Lord

LUKE 2.40-52

The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favour of God was upon him.

Now every year his parents went to Jerusalem for the festival of the Passover. And when he was twelve years old, they went up as usual for the festival. When the festival was ended and they started to return, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it. Assuming that he was in the group of travellers, they went a day's journey. Then they started to look for him among their relatives and friends. When they did not find him, they returned to Jerusalem to search for him. After three days they found him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. And all who heard him were amazed at his understanding and his answers. When his parents saw him they were astonished; and his mother said to him, 'Child, why have you treated us like this? Look, your father and I have been searching for you in great anxiety.' He said to them, 'Why were you searching for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?' But they did not understand what he said to them.

Then he went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them. His mother treasured all these things in her heart. And Jesus increased in wisdom and in years, and in divine and human favour.

This is the Gospel of the Lord: **Praise be to thee, O Christ.**

1. 2. Sermon Series on Forgiveness – the Cathedral Clergy will preach on the topic of Forgiveness at Choral Evensong at 6pm on Sunday evenings.
3. In addition to our usual weekday services we will also be holding short Prayer Liturgies in the Cathedral on Tuesdays and Thursdays at 12 noon.
4. Each Wednesday at 4.30pm we will post on the St Peter's Cathedral Facebook page a service entitled Afternoon Reflections for Children. Candles and Prayer Cards for use with this service will be given to Cathedral Kids and are available at the Cathedral Shop.

Cathedral Roof Maintenance – Work has commenced on the lower roof of the cathedral, above the clergy car parks. This will necessitate reallocation of car parking spaces for 10-16 weeks. The work is being funded from our Conservation Account, and Adelaide City Council will be making a grant of about 30%. Questions about the work, its funding, and future work will be answered at St Peter's Cathedral Annual Vestry meeting on Sunday March 26.

The Friends Annual General Meeting - Sunday 19th March in the CP Hall, at 12.00, following the 10.30 service. Members of the Friends are especially encouraged to attend to hear about our activities in 2022, our financial status and our plans for future events. It is also an opportunity to renew yearly memberships.
