

Welcome to St Peter's Cathedral. We are delighted to have you worship with us today for this service of Choral Evensong from the Book of Common Prayer. As the choir and clergy lead this service, allow the music and words to bring you into a stillness and prayerful reflection with God. Please join us in saying the words in bold. The hymns can be found in the separate hymn book. Indications for sitting, kneeling, and standing are a guide only.

St Peter's Cathedral resides on the lands of the Kurna people. We give thanks for their ancestors and acknowledge the ongoing right and responsibility of their elders to care for this Country. We are committed to work and pray towards a more just settlement for all Indigenous people and pay our respect to First Nations people with us.

Bethany is just over three kilometres from Jerusalem, across the Mount of Olives. It was so close that it was understandable that Jesus would have stayed there a number of nights in that fateful week before Passover. We know for certain that he had stayed there the night before his 'triumphal' entry into Jerusalem, which we celebrated this morning's Palm Sunday service; we also know that he returned to Bethany after all the huzzah of that entry. Scripture details some of the events at the house of Simon the Leper, with his daughters Martha and Mary, on the evening before Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey; but it is silent about what took place in that same household after he returned. Tonight, I want to reflect upon the mix of emotions which may have been felt by everyone staying in that house.

A reading from the Book of Exodus

EXODUS 13.1-3, 7-9

The Lord said to Moses: Consecrate to me all the firstborn; whatever is the first to open the womb among the Israelites, of human beings and animals, is mine.

Moses said to the people, 'Remember this day on which you came out of Egypt, out of the house of slavery, because the Lord brought you out from there by strength of hand; no leavened bread shall be eaten. Unleavened bread shall be eaten for seven days; no leavened bread shall be seen in your possession, and no leaven shall be seen among you in all your territory. You shall tell your child on that day, "It is because of what the Lord did for me when I came out of Egypt." It shall serve for you as a sign on your hand and as a reminder on your forehead, so that the teaching of the Lord may be on your lips; for with a strong hand the Lord brought you out of Egypt.

## SECOND LESSON

A reading from the Gospel according to John

JOHN 12.1-8

Six days before the Passover Jesus came to Bethany, the home of Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead. There they gave a dinner for him. Martha served, and Lazarus was one of those at the table with him.

Mary took a pound of costly perfume made of pure nard, anointed Jesus' feet, and wiped them with her hair. The house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume. But Judas Iscariot, one of his disciples (the one who was about to betray him), said, 'Why was this perfume not sold for three hundred denarii and the money given to the poor?'

(He said this not because he cared about the poor, but because he was a thief; he kept the common purse and used to steal what was put into it.) Jesus said, 'Leave her alone. She bought it so that she might keep it for the day of my burial. You always have the poor with you, but you do not always have me.'

## **Tea/coffee after regular services:**

Our community has slowly been returning to having morning tea on a semi-regular basis. We are now able to have the following gatherings:

- The Wednesday 10am community have tea and coffee after the first Wednesday each month. The next gathering will take place on Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> May.
- The Sunday 8am community have tea and coffee after the first Sunday of each month, The next gathering will take place on Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> May
- After the 10:30am service, there is tea and coffee provided every week! (Easter Day will not include a morning tea. Please join us again the week after – April 16<sup>th</sup>)

**Cathedral Roof Maintenance** – Work has commenced on the lower roof of the cathedral, above the clergy car parks. This will necessitate reallocation of car parking spaces for 10-16 weeks. The work is being funded from our Conservation Account, and Adelaide City Council will be making a grant of about 30%. Questions about the work, its funding, and future work will be answered at St Peter's Cathedral Annual Vestry meeting on Sunday March 26.

**The Friends' Plastic Bread-Tag Project:** This 12-month project is now in its closing stages - finishing at the end of May. Please keep bringing your plastic tags from bread bags and put them in the container on the table in the foyer of the cathedral. Proceeds from recycling these tags provides wheelchairs for the disadvantaged in South Africa.
