Welcome to St Peter's Cathedral. We are delighted to have you worship with us today for this service of Choral Evensong from the Book of Common Prayer. As the choir and clergy lead this service, allow the music and words to bring you into a stillness and prayerful reflection with God. Please join us in saying the words in bold. The hymns can be found in the separate hymn book. Indications for sitting, kneeling, and standing are a guide only.

St Peter's Cathedral resides on the lands of the Kaurna people. We give thanks for their ancestors and acknowledge the ongoing right and responsibility of their elders to care for this Country. We are committed to work and pray towards a more just settlement for all Indigenous people and pay our respect to First Nations people with us.

St Peter's Cathedral is a Christ-centred, sacramental, inclusive, thinking, mission-oriented faith community

This Sunday evening, we are commemorating, in advance, Anzac Day. Our preacher is Jack Monaghan who is a student at St Barnabas College and hopes to be accepted as an ordination candidate for the Diocese of Adelaide. Jack and Jeanie are members of the Cathedral congregation.

ANZAC Day is a solemn day as we give thanks for those who have served in the armed forces during the time of war. We give thanks for their sacrifice. As we all know ANZAC Day does not celebrate war, but is does recognise that people have given their lives so we can enjoy our freedom. We pray for their families who have also sacrificed much, and also for returned soldiers who carry the scars of the horrors of war. Ultimately, we pray and work for peace and a time when we will not 'learn war any more' (Micah 4: 3).
