

Welcome to St Peter's Cathedral. We are delighted to have you worship with us today for this Choral Eucharist from A Prayer Book for Australia. Please join us in saying the words in bold. The hymns can be found in the separate hymn book. All indications for sitting, kneeling, and standing are a guide only: please do whatever is most comfortable for you.

St Peter's Cathedral resides on the lands of the Kurna people. We give thanks for their ancestors and acknowledge the ongoing right and responsibility of their elders to care for this Country. We are committed to work and pray towards a more just settlement for all Indigenous people and pay our respect to First Nations people with us.

St Peter's Cathedral is a Christ-centred, sacramental, inclusive, thinking, mission-oriented faith community.

Today is Trinity Sunday which can be a real challenge for both preacher and congregation. For me, however, Trinity Sunday is not so much about the working out of theological mathematical conundrums. It is about worshipping the God who is in relationship; and considering how we might model this in the context of our lives. At the heart of the Trinity is a God who is eternal relationship. Theologian Paul Fiddes describes God the Trinity as 'Persons in Relationship'. Taking that as our cue leads us to say that relationships matter, and that is why we put so much effort into them. Relationships with our partners, our families, our friends, our neighbours, our communities, our schools, our workplaces, our churches: they all matter. Just like God the Trinity, these relationships are defined by equality, fairness, justice, and, most importantly, love. Coming to the end of 'Reconciliation Week', how might God as Trinity call us to work for justice and equality in our nation? Some clues will be given in this morning's sermon!



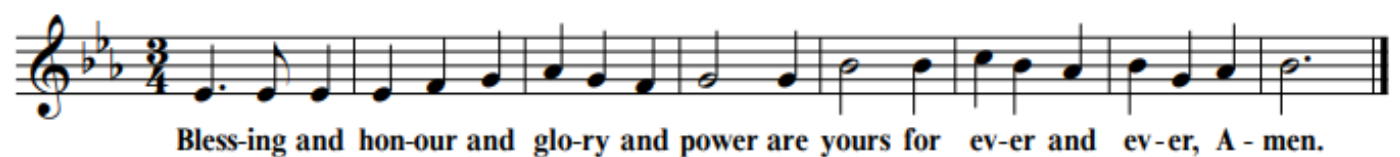
