# St Peter's Cathedral is a Christ-centred, sacramental, inclusive, thinking, mission-oriented faith community

This evening we welcome Bishop David Nyi Nyi Naing who is presently the Bishop of Mandalay in the Church of the Province of Myanmar. Bishop David has been consecrated as bishop for 12 years. Bishop David is married to Mary, and they have a son, Solomon. Bishop David has been instrumental in starting a new missionary diocese in Myanmar, the Diocese of Homelin. The Diocese of Mandalay is a companion diocese to the Diocese of Willochra. Bishop David and Mary have already spent time in the Dioceses of Willochra and the Murray.

The Cathedral has been raising funds through the sale of condiments to support the WASH project in Myanmar. This project through the Anglican Board of Mission seeks to help people in remote Myanmar communities access clean water in their homes, learn about environmental hygiene, and improve their livelihoods. The Rev'd Sally Sandford-Morgan has been coordinating the fundraising. Please speak to Sally for more information.

#### **SECOND LESSON**

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

ACTS 11.22-30, 13.1-3

News of this came to the ears of the church in Jerusalem, and they sent Barnabas to Antioch. When he came and saw the grace of God, he rejoiced, and he exhorted them all to remain faithful to the Lord with steadfast devotion; for he was a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and of faith. And a great many people were brought to the Lord. Then Barnabas went to Tarsus to look for Saul, and when he had found him, he brought him to Antioch. So it was that for an entire year they associated with the church and taught a great many people, and it was in Antioch that the disciples were first called 'Christians'.

At that time prophets came down from Jerusalem to Antioch. One of them named Agabus stood up and predicted by the Spirit that there would be a severe famine over all the world; and this took place during the reign of Claudius. The disciples determined that according to their ability, each would send relief to the believers living in Judea; this they did, sending it to the elders by Barnabas and Saul.

Now in the church at Antioch there were prophets and teachers: Barnabas, Simeon who was called Niger, Lucius of Cyrene, Manaen a member of the court of Herod the ruler, and Saul. While they were worshipping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, 'Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them.' Then after fasting and praying they laid their hands on them and sent them off.
