St Peter's Cathedral resides on the lands of the Kaurana people. We give thanks for their ancestors and acknowledge the ongoing right and responsibility of their elders to care for this Country. We are committed to work and pray towards a more just settlement for all Indigenous people and pay our respect to First Nations people with us.

St Peter's Cathedral is a Christ-centred, sacramental, inclusive, thinking, mission-oriented faith community

The Mission to Seafarers is an international organization of the Anglican Communion, offering practical, emotional, and spiritual support to seafarers around the world through a network of port-based chaplains and Seafarer Centres.

The 27 Australian Seafarer Centres give seafarers a chance to connect with their loved ones, often for the first time on a contract; mentally and spiritually recharge for the next leg of their voyage; stock up on personal supplies; and access medical, welfare and chaplaincy services.

Mission to Seafarers Port Adelaide is a chaplaincy-based mission of routine ship visiting, offering a friendly, interested Christian presence – listening and talking, observing, helping, referring, praying in several languages (!), and opening the MtS wifi hub for overseas phone calls – responding to specific requests and liaising with the Roman Catholic organization Stella Maris, Port authorities, unions and other port users.

The Mission to Seafarers was founded in 1856. Its Flying Angel now speaks an international language of loving care to seafarers. It represents the verse from Revelation (14:6):



Then I saw a flying angel in mid-heaven, with an eternal gospel to proclaim to those on earth, to every nation and tribe, language and people.

SECOND LESSON

A reading from Paul's Letter to the Romans

ROMANS 9.1-15

I am speaking the truth in Christ—I am not lying; my conscience confirms it by the Holy Spirit—I have great sorrow and unceasing anguish in my heart. For I could wish that I myself were accursed and cut off from Christ for the sake of my own people, my kindred according to the flesh. They are Israelites, and to them belong the adoption, the glory, the covenants, the giving of the law, the worship, and the promises; to them belong the patriarchs, and from them, according to the flesh, comes the Messiah, who is over all, God blessed for ever. Amen.

It is not as though the word of God had failed. For not all Israelites truly belong to Israel, and not all of Abraham's children are his true descendants; but 'It is through Isaac that descendants shall be named after you.' This means that it is not the children of the flesh who are the children of God, but the children of the promise are counted as descendants. For this is what the promise said, 'About this time I will return and Sarah shall have a son.' Nor is that all; something similar happened to Rebecca when she had conceived children by one husband, our ancestor Isaac. Even before they had been born or had done anything good or bad (so that God's purpose of election might continue, not by works but by his call) she was told, 'The elder shall serve the younger.' As it is written,

'I have loved Jacob,
but I have hated Esau.'

What then are we to say? Is there injustice on God's part? By no means! For he says to Moses,

'I will have mercy on whom I have mercy,
and I will have compassion on whom I have compassion.'

Here endeth the second lesson.
