



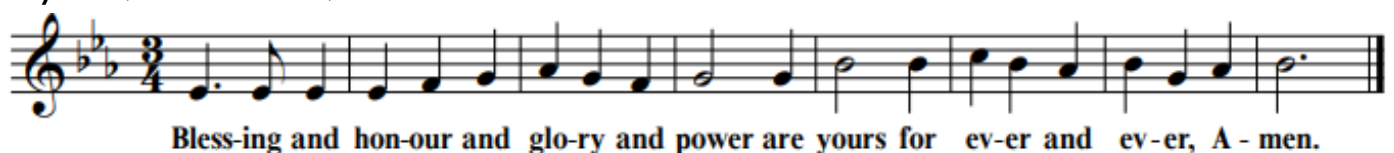
Let us proclaim the mystery of faith:
