The Lesson is written in the 65th Chapter of the book of the prophet Isaiah, beginning at the 17th verse.

For I am about to create new heavens

 in what I am creating,
 for I am about to create Jerusalem as a joy
 and its people as a delight.
 I will rejoice in Jerusalem
 and delight in my people;
 no more shall the sound of weeping be heard in it
 or the cry of distress.
 No more shall there be in it
 an infant who lives but a few days
 or an old person who does not live out a lifetime,
 for one who dies at a hundred years will be considered a youth,
 and one who falls short of a hundred will be considered accursed.

SECOND LESSON

REVELATION 21.1-6, 22-26

The Lesson is written in the 21st chapter of the Book of Revelation,
beginning at the 1st verse.

I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. And I saw the holy city, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying,

“See, the home of God is among mortals.
He will dwell with them;
they will be his peoples,
and God himself will be with them and be their God;
he will wipe every tear from their eyes.
Death will be no more;
mourning and crying and pain will be no more,
for the first things have passed away.”

And the one who was seated on the throne said, “See, I am making all things new.” Also he said, “Write this, for these words are trustworthy and true.” Then he said to me, “It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End. To the thirsty I will give water as a gift from the spring of the water of life.

I saw no temple in the city, for its temple is the Lord God the Almighty and the Lamb. And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God is its light, and its lamp is the Lamb.
