Welcome to St Peter's Cathedral. We are delighted to have you worship with us today for this service of Choral Evensong from the Book of Common Prayer. St Peter's Cathedral resides on the lands of the Kaurna people. We give thanks for their ancestors and acknowledge the ongoing right and responsibility of their elders to care for this Country. We are committed to work and pray towards a more just settlement for all Indigenous people and pay our respect to First Nations people with us.

St Peter's Cathedral is a Christ-centred, sacramental, inclusive, thinking, mission-oriented faith community.

This evening we welcome the 'Friends of Willochra' and the Bishop of Willochra, the Right Reverend Jeremy James, who will be our preacher. The Friends of Willochra gather once a year in the Cathedral preceded by an afternoon tea to show their support and encouragement to the Diocese of Willochra. The Diocese of Willochra was formed in 1915 and covers most of South Australia, taking in the Yorke and Eyre Peninsulas and extending to the borders of the Northern Territory and Western Australia. The Diocese of Willochra needs our support and prayer as it ministers to many farming, mining, and isolated communities.

Was shield or spear to be seen among forty thousand in Israel?

My heart goes out to the commanders of Israel who offered themselves willingly among the people. Bless the Lord.

'Tell of it, you who ride on white donkeys, you who sit on rich carpets, and you who walk by the way.

To the sound of musicians at the watering-places, there they repeat the triumphs of the Lord,

the triumphs of his peasantry in Israel.

'Then down to the gates marched the people of the Lord.

Arise, Barak, lead away your captives,
O son of Abinoam.

SECOND LESSON MATTHEW 24.36-51

The Lesson is written in the 24th chapter of the Gospel according to Matthew, beginning at the 36th verse.

Jesus said, 'But about that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. For as the days of Noah were, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day Noah entered the ark, and they knew nothing until the flood came and swept them all away, so too will be the coming of the Son of Man. Then two will be in the field; one will be taken and one will be left. Two women will be grinding meal together; one will be taken and one will be left. Keep awake therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. But understand this: if the owner of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into. Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour.

'Who then is the faithful and wise slave, whom his master has put in charge of his household, to give the other slaves their allowance of food at the proper time? Blessed is that slave whom his master will find at work when he arrives. Truly I tell you, he will put that one in charge of all his possessions. But if that wicked slave says to himself, "My master is delayed", and he begins to beat his fellow-slaves, and eats and drinks with drunkards, the master of that slave will come on a day when he does not expect him and at an hour that he does not know. He will cut him in pieces and put him with the hypocrites, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.
