THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT SUNDAY 17 DECEMBER 2023

8 AM

A warm welcome to St Peter's Cathedral as we gather for worship this morning.

St Peter's Cathedral resides on the lands of the Kaurna people. We give thanks for their ancestors and acknowledge the ongoing right and responsibility of their elders to care for this Country. We are committed to work and pray towards a more just settlement for all Indigenous people and pay our respect to First Nations people with us.

St Peter's Cathedral is a Christ-centred, sacramental, inclusive, thinking, mission-oriented faith community.

Has God gone to sleep; we often wonder? Have we been abandoned? Does God even care? These thoughts are not just ours, but the people of Judah during the time of Isaiah were wondering the same thing. Isaiah chapters 40 - 66 are generally believed to come to us from the time of Cyrus of Persia (539 B.C.E), and the author(s) are looking forward to the time of restoration and return after deportation to Babylon. The people of the time, however, needed convincing. Isaiah meets them with a word of promise. The people will return and 'they will be called oaks of righteousness, the planting of the Lord ... they will build up the ancient ruins ... they shall repair the ruined cities ...' (Isaiah 61: 3 - 4).

The Advent theme of waiting is an important one. Salvation has come to us, but we wait for its completion. Patience is needed. We live by faith because God is who God promises to be, and we are who God says we are. We wait in joyful expectation for 'the ransomed of the Lord shall return and come to Zion with singing ... and sorrow and sighing shall flee away' (Isa 51: 11). These are wonderful words of promise and hope, and they are ours!

CEREMONY OF THE LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLE

Celebrant Today is the third Sunday in Advent. We light a candle each week to remind us

that Jesus brings light into the dark places of the world.

The first candle (purple, the Candle of Hope) is lit

Reader We light the candle of hope to proclaim that God's light

is coming into the world.

The second candle (purple, the Candle of Peace) is lit

Reader We light the candle of peace to proclaim that God's promises

will be fulfilled in the birth of Jesus – Prince of Peace.

The third candle (rose-pink, the Candle of Joy) is lit

Celebrant We rejoice and sing out with gladness at the message of God's salvation.

Reader We light the candle of joy to celebrate that God's saving power

is coming into the world.

All God of joy, we rejoice as we look forward to your breaking into

human history, revealing in person your justice and your love. Amen.

THE COLLECT OF THE DAY

O LORD Jesu Christ, who at thy first coming didst send thy messenger to prepare thy way before thee: Grant that the ministers and stewards of thy mysteries may likewise so prepare and make ready thy way, by turning the hearts of the disobedient to the wisdom of the just, that at thy second coming to judge the world we may be found an acceptable people in thy sight, who livest and reignest with the Father and the Holy Spirit, ever one God, world without end. **Amen.**

FIRST READING ISAIAH 61.1-4, 8-11

A reading from the Prophet Isaiah.

The spirit of the Lord God is upon me,

because the Lord has anointed me;

he has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed,

to bind up the broken-hearted,

to proclaim liberty to the captives,

and release to the prisoners;

to proclaim the year of the Lord 's favour,

and the day of vengeance of our God;

to comfort all who mourn;

to provide for those who mourn in Zion-

to give them a garland instead of ashes,

the oil of gladness instead of mourning,

the mantle of praise instead of a faint spirit.

They will be called oaks of righteousness, the planting of the Lord, to display his glory. They shall build up the ancient ruins, they shall raise up the former devastations; they shall repair the ruined cities, the devastations of many generations. For I the Lord love justice, I hate robbery and wrongdoing; I will faithfully give them their recompense, and I will make an everlasting covenant with them. Their descendants shall be known among the nations, and their offspring among the peoples; all who see them shall acknowledge that they are a people whom the Lord has blessed. I will greatly rejoice in the Lord, my whole being shall exult in my God; for he has clothed me with the garments of salvation, he has covered me with the robe of righteousness, as a bridegroom decks himself with a garland, and as a bride adorns herself with her jewels. For as the earth brings forth its shoots, and as a garden causes what is sown in it to spring up, so the Lord God will cause righteousness and praise to spring up before all the nations.

SECOND READING

1 Thessalonians 5.12-28

A reading from the first letter of Paul to the Thessalonians.

But we appeal to you, brothers and sisters, to respect those who labour among you, and have charge of you in the Lord and admonish you; esteem them very highly in love because of their work. Be at peace among yourselves. And we urge you, beloved, to admonish the idlers, encourage the faint-hearted, help the weak, be patient with all of them.

See that none of you repays evil for evil, but always seek to do good to one another and to all. Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. Do not quench the Spirit. Do not despise the words of prophets, but test everything; hold fast to what is good; abstain from every form of evil. May the God of peace himself sanctify you entirely; and may your spirit and soul and body be kept sound and blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. The one who calls you is faithful, and he will do this. Beloved, pray for us. Greet all the brothers and sisters with a holy kiss. I solemnly command you by the Lord that this letter be read to all of them. The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you.

THE GOSPELJOHN 1.6-8, 19-28

The Lord be with you.

And with thy spirit.

The Holy Gospel is written in the 1st Chapter of the Gospel according to John beginning at verse 6.

Glory be to thee, O Lord.

There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light.

This is the testimony given by John when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, 'Who are you?' He confessed and did not deny it, but confessed, 'I am not the Messiah.' And they asked him, 'What then? Are you Elijah?' He said, 'I am not.' 'Are you the prophet?' He answered, 'No.' Then they said to him, 'Who are you? Let us have an answer for those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?' He said,

'I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness,

"Make straight the way of the Lord",

as the prophet Isaiah said.

Now they had been sent from the Pharisees. They asked him, 'Why then are you baptising if you are neither the Messiah, nor Elijah, nor the prophet?' John answered them, 'I baptize with water. Among you stands one whom you do not know, the one who is coming after me; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandal.' This took place in Bethany across the Jordan where John was baptizing.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Lent Study 2024 – A Truth Universally Acknowledged - advance notice – Lent studies will take place on Mondays at 10am and 7pm and on Tuesdays at 5pm. Ash Wednesday is February 14 and our studies will commence in the following week. The Lent Study is based on a book A Truth Universally Acknowledged by Venerable Rachel Mann.
