

CHORAL EVENSONG THE SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER 12 MAY 2024

6 PM

Welcome to St Peter's Cathedral. We are delighted to have you worship with us today for this service of Choral Evensong from the Book of Common Prayer. As the choir and clergy lead this service, allow the music and words to bring you into a stillness and prayerful reflection with God. Please join us in saying the words in bold. The hymns can be found in the separate hymn book. Indications for sitting, kneeling, and standing are a guide only.

St Peter's Cathedral resides on the lands of the Kaurna people. We give thanks for their ancestors and acknowledge the ongoing right and responsibility of their elders to care for this Country. We are committed to work and pray towards a more just settlement for all Indigenous people and pay our respect to First Nations people with us.

St Peter's Cathedral is a Christ-centred, sacramental, inclusive, thinking, mission-oriented faith community.

'A little while, and you will no longer see me, and again a little while, and you will see me.' (John 16.16). No wonder the disciples were confused. What was Jesus talking about? Jesus here is preparing the disciples for his death and resurrection. In a little while he will be dead and in a little while they will see him in his resurrected state. It was natural, of course, that they would not understand this. Included in this 'little while' is Jesus going to the Father, the Ascension.

The timeframes in John's gospel are different to that of Luke which records the Ascension (Luke 24.50; Acts 1.6-10) and the Pentecost story (Acts 2.1-13) differently. In John, Crucifixion, Resurrection, Ascension, and Pentecost are held tightly together. The timeframes are not the focus. All these events are theologically inseparable for John. Along with 'the Word becoming flesh', the Incarnation (John 1.14), they present Jesus as he truly is, and who he was from the very beginning of the story told by John.

THE FIRST LESSON GENESIS 14.14-20

A reading from the Book of Genesis, Chapter 14, beginning at verse 14.

When Abram heard that his nephew Lot had been taken captive, he led forth his trained men, born in his house, three hundred and eighteen of them, and went in pursuit as far as Dan. He divided his forces against them by night, he and his servants, and routed them and pursued them to Hobah, north of Damascus. Then he brought back all the goods, and also brought back his nephew Lot with his goods, and the women and the people.

After his return from the defeat of Chedorlaomer and the kings who were with him, the king of Sodom went out to meet him at the Valley of Shaveh (that is, the King's Valley). And King Melchizedek of Salem brought out bread and wine; he was priest of God Most High. He blessed him and said,

'Blessed be Abram by God Most High, maker of heaven and earth; and blessed be God Most High, who has delivered your enemies into your hand!'

And Abram gave him one-tenth of everything.

SECOND LESSON JOHN 16.16-24

A reading from the Gospel of John, Chapter 16, beginning at verse 16.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'A little while, and you will no longer see me, and again a little while, and you will see me.' Then some of his disciples said to one another, 'What does he mean by saying to us, "A little while, and you will no longer see me, and again a little while, and you will see me"; and "Because I am going to the Father"?' They said, 'What does he mean by this "a little while"?

We do not know what he is talking about.' Jesus knew that they wanted to ask him, so he said to them, 'Are you discussing among yourselves what I meant when I said, "A little while, and you will no longer see me, and again a little while, and you will see me"? Very truly, I tell you, you will weep and mourn, but the world will rejoice; you will have pain, but your pain will turn into joy. When a woman is in labour, she has pain, because her hour has come. But when her child is born, she no longer remembers the anguish because of the joy of having brought a human being into the world. So you have pain now; but I will see you again, and your hearts will rejoice, and no one will take your joy from you. On that day you will ask nothing of me. Very truly, I tell you, if you ask anything of the Father in my name, he will give it to you. Until now you have not asked for anything in my name. Ask and you will receive, so that your joy may be complete.
