Welcome to St Peter's Cathedral. We are delighted to have you worship with us today for this service of Evensong from the Book of Common Prayer. The singing of Evensong to classic Anglican chant was for many years a regular feature of worship in Anglican churches across the world. This evening, while the Cathedral Choir is on holidays, we offer our worship in this form. The hymns can be found in the separate hymn book. Indications for sitting, kneeling, and standing are a guide only.

St Peter's Cathedral resides on the lands of the Kaurna people. We give thanks for their ancestors and acknowledge the ongoing right and responsibility of their elders to care for this Country. We are committed to work and pray towards a more just settlement for all Indigenous people and pay our respect to First Nations people with us.

St Peter's Cathedral is a Christ-centred, sacramental, inclusive, thinking, mission-oriented faith community.

St Paul, in his Second Letter to the people of Corinth, reflects on what it means to be a devoted follower of Christ. As the letter draws to a close, he exhorts the people:

Examine yourselves to see whether you are living in the faith. Test yourselves. Do you not realize that Jesus Christ is in you? (v5)

As we gather this evening whilst our Cathedral Choir enjoys a well-earned holiday, we will sing Evensong ourselves supported by the music of the organ. As we sing, pray, and hear scripture read, we might wonder about Paul's question. We might wonder what it looks like for us to "live in the faith", to live knowing that Jesus Christ is in us.

Paul closes his letter with the beautiful blessing that we know as The Grace. May his words bless us as they blessed the people of Corinth so many years ago.





THE FIRST LESSON

2 SAMUEL 5.11-13, 17-25

The lesson from the second book of the prophet Samuel, chapter 5, beginning at verse 11.

King Hiram of Tyre sent messengers to David, along with cedar trees, and carpenters and masons who built David a house. David then perceived that the Lord had established him king over Israel, and that he had exalted his kingdom for the sake of his people Israel.

In Jerusalem, after he came from Hebron, David took more concubines and wives; and more sons and daughters were born to David.

When the Philistines heard that David had been anointed king over Israel, all the Philistines went up in search of David; but David heard about it and went down to the stronghold. Now the Philistines had come and spread out in the valley of Rephaim. David inquired of the Lord, 'Shall I go up against the Philistines? Will you give them into my hand?' The Lord said to David, 'Go up; for I will certainly give the Philistines into your hand.' So David came to Baal-perazim, and David defeated them there. He said, 'The Lord has burst forth against my enemies before me, like a bursting flood.' Therefore that place is called Baal-perazim. The Philistines abandoned their idols there, and David and his men carried them away.


Once again the Philistines came up, and were spread out in the valley of Rephaim. When David inquired of the Lord, he said, 'You shall not go up; go round to their rear, and come upon them opposite the balsam trees. When you hear the sound of marching in the tops of the balsam trees, then be on the alert; for then the Lord has gone out before you to strike down the army of the Philistines.' David did just as the Lord had commanded him; and he struck down the Philistines from Geba all the way to Gezer.

SECOND LESSON 2 CORINTHIANS 13.4-13

The lesson from the second letter of Paul to the Corinthians.

Christ was crucified in weakness, but lives by the power of God. For we are weak in him, but in dealing with you we will live with him by the power of God.

Examine yourselves to see whether you are living in the faith. Test yourselves. Do you not realize that Jesus Christ is in you?—unless, indeed, you fail to pass the test! I hope you will find out that we have not failed. But we pray to God that you may not do anything wrong—not that we may appear to have passed the test, but that you may do what is right, though we may seem to have failed. For we cannot do anything against the truth, but only for the truth. For we rejoice when we are weak and you are strong. This is what we pray for, that you may become perfect. So I write these things while I am away from you, so that when I come, I may not have to be severe in using the authority that the Lord has given me for building up and not for tearing down.

Finally, brothers and sisters, farewell. Put things in order, listen to my appeal, agree with one another, live in peace; and the God of love and peace will be with you. Greet one another with a holy kiss. All the saints greet you.


The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with all of you.


THE COLLECT OF THE DAY

Sunday Night with Lynn Arnold (7 pm on 1079Life). Tonight's program will be the second of two programs featuring Lynn's conversation with the Rev'd Professor Dr Jerry Pillay, General Secretary of the World Council of Churches, during his recent visit to Adelaide.

Confirmation is a sign that a person has reached maturity and is now able to take responsibility for their own faith. It also strengthens and deepens the connection to the Church that is established at baptism. This year Confirmation will be held on **Sunday 25 August**. Our first major mission outreach plan for 2024 is the AnglicareSA Solar Panel project. This venture provides solar panel installations on community housing, with the ability for excess power to be consolidated and shared. We aimed for a target of at least \$5,000, to be increased considerably by the philanthropic support of two donors who will both match funding up to an amount of \$5,000; and AnglicareSA will likewise match the Cathedral's total. So \$5,000 raised by the Cathedral community would generate \$20,000,

enough for four complete installations that will benefit not only the residents of the properties but additional residents where the infrastructure for power sharing exists. **Tax Deductible donations** can be made direct to AnglicareSA through a dedicated donations page for the Cathedral at https://anglicaresa.com.au/donate-support/solar-fundraising/. As of 30 June we raised in excess of \$13,000. With matched donor funding, this becomes \$23,000 before AnglicareSA additional matched funding. Thanks be to God!



The recent **Car Boot Sale and Baked Goods fundraiser** contributed \$919 towards the total. The Friends of the Cathedral's soup sale on the same day raised a further \$200.

The homemade jam and marmalade fundraiser has concluded. III jars were sold and \$945 was raised and will be used for Friends' initiatives around the Cathedral. Thank you to the Cathedral Shop for partnering to sell the jams, and especially great appreciation to jam maker extraordinaire Graeme Butler whose wonderful work this was. God bless you.

AnglicareSA Socks and Underwear. In June we are also supporting the Magdalene Centre in the provision of socks and underwear for those in need. All items must be new and in unopened packaging. Multiple packs of socks and underwear are very useful. All donations will help, particularly small sized women's underwear. Underwear is an underdonated, yet most needed, item of clothing. No one should be deprived of the simple daily necessity of clean underwear that many of us take for granted. Hygiene and physical comfort are a part of this basic human need, and provide dignity and self-esteem. Inquiries to Julie Doherty.

The Cathedral Council will be focussing on this in July and August, and every member of the community is invited to contribute their ideas, and to pray about how we might grow in discipleship and share the good news.
