

CHORAL EVENSONG THE 21ST SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST 13 OCTOBER 2024

6 PM

Welcome to St Peter's Cathedral. We are delighted to have you worship with us today for this service of Choral Evensong from the Book of Common Prayer. As the choir and clergy lead this service, allow the music and words to bring you into a stillness and prayerful reflection with God. Please join us in saying the words in bold. The hymns can be found in the separate hymn book. Indications for sitting, kneeling, and standing are a guide only.

St Peter's Cathedral resides on the lands of the Kaurna people. We give thanks for their ancestors and acknowledge the ongoing right and responsibility of their elders to care for this Country. We are committed to work and pray towards a more just settlement for all Indigenous people and pay our respect to First Nations people with us.

St Peter's Cathedral is a Christ-centred, sacramental, inclusive, thinking, mission-oriented faith community.

This evening, we continue with the Book of Job. Chapter 28 is regarded by some biblical scholars as an interpolation. A passage that is not a natural fit with the rest of the book. It is a reflection on wisdom. However, other biblical scholars argue that it is consistent with the theology of Job in that wisdom resides with God and not human knowledge. The traditional and proverbial 'Fear of God is the beginning of wisdom' (Proverbs 1: 7). This fits Job's insights that God is God and not controlled by human thought or will.

Reading Job allows us to question and wonder, and that is wise in itself. 'Off the shelf' pat answers do not last long in the actual living of life; especially in the context of suffering. The Book of Job gives us permission to embrace the mystery that is both God and life. Blessings,

THE FIRST LESSON

JOB 28.12-28

The lesson from the Book of Job, chapter 28.

Job said:

'Where shall wisdom be found?

And where is the place of understanding?

Mortals do not know the way to it,

and it is not found in the land of the living.

The deep says, "It is not in me", and the sea says, "It is not with me."

It cannot be bought for gold,

and silver cannot be weighed out as its price.

It cannot be valued in the gold of Ophir, in precious onyx or sapphire.

Gold and glass cannot equal it,

nor can it be exchanged for jewels of fine gold.

No mention shall be made of coral or of crystal; the price of wisdom is above pearls.

The chrysolite of Ethiopia cannot compare with it, nor can it be valued in pure gold.

'Where then does wisdom come from?

And where is the place of understanding?

It is hidden from the eyes of all living, and concealed from the birds of the air.

Abaddon and Death say,

"We have heard a rumour of it with our ears."

'God understands the way to it, and he knows its place.

For he looks to the ends of the earth, and sees everything under the heavens.

When he gave to the wind its weight, and apportioned out the waters by measure;

when he made a decree for the rain, and a way for the thunderbolt;

then he saw it and declared it;

he established it, and searched it out.

And he said to humankind,

"Truly, the fear of the Lord, that is wisdom; and to depart from evil is understanding."

SECOND LESSON HEBREWS 4.1-11

The lesson from the letter to the Hebrews, chapter 4, beginning at verse 1.

Therefore, while the promise of entering his rest is still open, let us take care that none of you should seem to have failed to reach it. For indeed the good news came to us just as to them; but the message they heard did not benefit them, because they were not united by faith with those who listened. For we who have believed enter that rest, just as God has said,

'As in my anger I swore,

"They shall not enter my rest",

though his works were finished at the foundation of the world. For in one place it speaks about the seventh day as follows: 'And God rested on the seventh day from all his works.' And again in this place it says, 'They shall not enter my rest.' Since therefore it remains open for some to enter it, and those who formerly received the good news failed to enter because of disobedience, again he sets a certain day—'today'—saying through David much later, in the words already quoted,

'Today, if you hear his voice, do not harden your hearts.'

For if Joshua had given them rest, God would not speak later about another day. So then, a sabbath rest still remains for the people of God; for those who enter God's rest also cease from their labours as God did from his. Let us therefore make every effort to enter that rest, so that no one may fall through such disobedience as theirs.
