St Peter's Cathedral resides on the lands of the Kaurna people. We give thanks for their ancestors and acknowledge the ongoing right and responsibility of their elders to care for this Country. We are committed to work and pray towards a more just settlement for all Indigenous people and pay our respect to First Nations people with us.

St Peter's Cathedral is a Christ-centred, sacramental, inclusive, thinking, mission-oriented faith community.

We welcome as preacher today the Reverend Rachel Taber-Hamilton. Rachel has been our Theologian in Residence. This program was offered in conjunction with St Barnabas College and part-sponsored by the Anglican Board of Mission. Rachel comes to us from the Diocese of Olympia in the Episcopal Church of the United States of America (ECUSA) where she is the Rector of Trinity Episcopal Church, Everett, Washington. Rachel is of First Nations heritage (Shackan, British Columbia, Canada). Rachel serves the church in many capacities including membership of the Anglican Indigenous Network, a network of the Anglican Communion. We have appreciated Rachel being with us and look forward to what she shares with us today. Rachel is accompanied by her partner, Nigel, who is also a priest in ECUSA.

THE FIRST LESSON

MAGNIFICAT

He remembering his mercy hath holpen his servant Israel: as he promised to our forefathers, Abraham and his seed, for ever. SECOND LESSON

The lesson from the letter to the Hebrews, chapter 6, beginning at verse 19.

We have this hope, a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul, a hope that enters the inner shrine behind the curtain, where Jesus, a forerunner on our behalf, has entered, having become a high priest for ever according to the order of Melchizedek.

This 'King Melchizedek of Salem, priest of the Most High God, met Abraham as he was returning from defeating the kings and blessed him'; and to him Abraham apportioned 'onetenth of everything'. His name, in the first place, means 'king of righteousness'; next he is also king of Salem, that is, 'king of peace'. Without father, without mother, without genealogy, having neither beginning of days nor end of life, but resembling the Son of God, he remains a priest for ever.

On Sunday 3 November, we will celebrate both of these festivals, with All Saints in the morning, and in the evening, instead of Evensong, the Cathedral Choir will sing Fauré's beautiful Requiem in celebration of All Souls, set within the context of the eucharist.
