## FIRST READING

JOB 38.1-7, 34-41

A reading from the Book of Job.

The Lord answered Job out of the whirlwind:

‘Who is this that darkens counsel by words without knowledge?

Gird up your loins like a man,

I will question you, and you shall declare to me.

‘Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth?

Tell me, if you have understanding.

Who determined its measurements—surely you know!

Or who stretched the line upon it?

‘Can you lift up your voice to the clouds,

so that a flood of waters may cover you?

## PSALM 104.1-10, 26

Bless the Lord, O my soul:

and laid the beams of your dwelling upon their waters;

**You make the clouds your chariot:**

## SECOND READING

HEBREWS 5.1-10

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews.

Every high priest chosen from among mortals is put in charge of things pertaining to God on their behalf, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He is able to deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is subject to weakness; and because of this he must offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the people. And one does not presume to take this honour, but takes it only when called by God, just as Aaron was.

So also Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the one who said to him,

‘You are my Son,  
today I have begotten you’;

as he says also in another place,

‘You are a priest for ever,  
according to the order of Melchizedek.’

In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him, having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek.

## GOSPEL READING

MARK 10.32-45

The Lord be with you.

**And with thy spirit.**

The Holy Gospel is written in the 10th Chapter of the Gospel according to Mark, beginning at verse 32.

**Glory be to thee, O Lord.**

They were on the road, going up to Jerusalem, and Jesus was walking ahead of them; they were amazed, and those who followed were afraid. He took the twelve aside again and began to tell them what was to happen to him, saying, 'See, we are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be handed over to the chief priests and the scribes, and they will condemn him to death; then they will hand him over to the Gentiles; they will mock him, and spit upon him, and flog him, and kill him; and after three days he will rise again.'

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to him and said to him, 'Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you.' And he said to them, 'What is it you want me to do for you?' And they said to him, 'Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory.' But Jesus said to them, 'You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?' They replied, 'We are able.' Then Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right hand or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared.'

When the ten heard this, they began to be angry with James and John. So Jesus called them and said to them, 'You know that among the Gentiles those whom they recognize as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. But it is not so among you; but whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

**All Saints Day**, which falls on 1 November each year, is one of the great festivals of the Church's year, and the Australian lectionary encourages its observance on the following Sunday. On this day we remember those who in their earthly labours were particularly shining examples of life in Christ. Closely related to All Saints Day is **All Souls Day** (observed on 2 November) when we remember and pray for all those who have died, especially those who have meant much to us in the course of our lives. On Sunday 3 November, we will celebrate both of these festivals, with All Saints in the morning, and in the evening, instead of Evensong, the Cathedral Choir will sing Fauré's beautiful Requiem in celebration of All Souls, set within the context of the eucharist.

**Soldier On Fundraiser:** On **Sunday 17 November at 2pm** we will be hosting a fundraising concert for *Soldier On*, an organisation which delivers holistic support services that enable current and former Australian Defence Force personnel, and their families, to lead meaningful civilian lives.
