Welcome to St Peter's Cathedral. We are delighted to have you worship with us today for this Eucharist from the Book of Common Prayer. The order of service is in the separate booklet.

St Peter's Cathedral resides on the lands of the Kaurna people. We give thanks for their ancestors and acknowledge the ongoing right and responsibility of their elders to care for this Country. We are committed to work and pray towards a more just settlement for all Indigenous people and pay our respect to First Nations people with us.

St Peter's Cathedral is a Christ-centred, sacramental, inclusive, thinking, mission-oriented faith community.

Today we welcome as our guest preacher the Rev'd Helen Phillips. Helen was ordained in Melbourne in 1996 and has extensive experience in chaplaincy and parish ministry in Melbourne and Brisbane. She recently relocated to Adelaide to take up the position of Flourishing Communities Facilitator within the Archbishop's Office. She has a leading role in guiding the implementation of the Diocesan vision. Helen's work includes supporting church communities to thrive amidst change, and embrace new opportunities for mission and ministry. She is charged with creating and fostering a culture of innovation, encouraging networks, sharing, and outreach. And, as a reminder that we must be outwardly as well as inwardly focussed, promote the use of church buildings in novel ways for mission and community outreach in addition to their primary function for the worshipping community.

Helen has already met with the Cathedral Executive to consider the ways in which the Cathedral, as a community, engages both with its congregations and further afield, and to explore new opportunities. Please make yourselves known to her.

LORD, we beseech thee to keep thy household the Church in continual godliness; that through thy protection it may be free from all adversities, and devoutly given to serve thee in good works, to thy glory of thy Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

FIRST READING

JOB 42.1-6, 10-17

A reading from the Book of Job.

Job answered the Lord:

'I know that you can do all things, and that no purpose of yours can be thwarted.
"Who is this that hides counsel without knowledge?" Therefore I have uttered what I did not understand, things too wonderful for me, which I did not know.
"Hear, and I will speak; I will question you, and you declare to me."
I had heard of you by the hearing of the ear, but now my eye sees you; therefore I despise myself, and repent in dust and ashes.'

And the Lord restored the fortunes of Job when he had prayed for his friends; and the Lord gave Job twice as much as he had before. Then there came to him all his brothers and sisters and all who had known him before, and they ate bread with him in his house; they showed him sympathy and comforted him for all the evil that the Lord had brought upon him; and each of them gave him a piece of money and a gold ring. The Lord blessed the latter days of Job more than his beginning; and he had fourteen thousand sheep, six thousand camels, a thousand yoke of oxen, and a thousand donkeys. He also had seven sons and three daughters. He named the first Jemimah, the second Keziah, and the third Keren-happuch. In all the land there were no women so beautiful as Job's daughters; and their father gave them an inheritance along with their brothers. After this Job lived for one hundred and forty years, and saw his children, and his children's children, four generations. And Job died, old and full of days.

PSALM 34.1-8, 19-22

Please respond with the words in bold

I will bless the Lord continually: his praise shall be always in my mouth. Let my soul boast of the Lord: the humble shall hear it and rejoice. O praise the Lord with me: let us exalt his name together.

For I sought the Lord's help and he answered: and he freed me from all my fears. Look towards him and be bright with joy: your faces shall not be ashamed. Here is a wretch who cried, and the Lord heard me: and saved me from all my troubles. The angel of the Lord encamps round those who fear him: and delivers them in their need. O taste and see that the Lord is good: happy are they that hide in him! The trials of the righteous are many: but our God delivers us from them all. He guards all our bones: so that not one is broken. Evil will slay the wicked: and those who hate the righteous will be destroyed.

The Lord ransoms the lives of his servants: and none who hide in him will be destroyed.

SECOND READING

HEBREWS 7.21-28

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews.

Brothers and sisters: Jesus became a priest with an oath, because of the one who said to him,

'The Lord has sworn and will not change his mind, "You are a priest for ever""—

accordingly Jesus has also become the guarantee of a better covenant.

Furthermore, the former priests were many in number, because they were prevented by death from continuing in office; but he holds his priesthood permanently, because he continues for ever. Consequently he is able for all time to save those who approach God through him, since he always lives to make intercession for them.

For it was fitting that we should have such a high priest, holy, blameless, undefiled, separated from sinners, and exalted above the heavens. Unlike the other high priests, he has no need to offer sacrifices day after day, first for his own sins, and then for those of the people; this he did once for all when he offered himself. For the law appoints as high priests those who are subject to weakness, but the word of the oath, which came later than the law, appoints a Son who has been made perfect for ever.

GOSPEL READING

The Lord be with you. And with thy spirit.

The Holy Gospel is written in the 10th Chapter of the Gospel according to Mark, beginning at verse 46.

Glory be to thee, O Lord.

As Jesus and his disciples and a large crowd were leaving Jericho, Bartimaeus son of Timaeus, a blind beggar, was sitting by the roadside. When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout out and say, 'Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!' Many sternly ordered him to be quiet, but he cried out even more loudly, 'Son of David, have mercy on me!' Jesus stood still and said, 'Call him here.' And they called the blind man, saying to him, 'Take heart; get up, he is calling you.' So throwing off his cloak, he sprang up and came to Jesus. Then Jesus said to him, 'What do you want me to do for you?' The blind man said to him, 'My teacher, let me see again.' Jesus said to him, 'Go; your faith has made you well.' Immediately he regained his sight and followed him on the way.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Next Sunday, 3 November, we will celebrate both of these festivals, with All Saints in the morning, and in the evening, instead of Evensong, the Cathedral Choir will sing Fauré's beautiful Requiem in celebration of All Souls, set within the context of the eucharist.


