Welcome to St Peter's Cathedral. We are delighted to have you worship with us today for this service of Choral Evensong from the Book of Common Prayer. As the choir and clergy lead this service, allow the music and words to bring you into a stillness and prayerful reflection with God. Please join us in saying the words in bold. The hymns can be found in the separate hymn book. Indications for sitting, kneeling, and standing are a guide only.

St Peter's Cathedral resides on the lands of the Kaurna people. We give thanks for their ancestors and acknowledge the ongoing right and responsibility of their elders to care for this Country. We are committed to work and pray towards a more just settlement for all Indigenous people and pay our respect to First Nations people with us.

## St Peter's Cathedral is a Christ-centred, sacramental, inclusive, thinking, mission-oriented faith community.

This evening, we gather to celebrate the Feast Day of St Simon and St Jude. Our Simon and Jude are not Jesus' best friend Simon Peter and not the infamous Judas Iscariot. They are just two others in the list. Two apostles whom we know very little about. Two of the crew. A bit like most of us really. Members of Jesus' disciples who are not famous or notable, not dramatically weak or dramatically brave.

Only Jesus chose them. He went up a mountain and in the presence of the one he knew as "Abba, Father", Jesus pondered his need for twelve apostles who would be loyal companions in his mission of inaugurating the Kingdom of God. And Jesus chose not only his better-known apostles but also Simon and Jude. To be members of the crew. Chosen by Jesus. Like us. People who follow Jesus sensing that there is something about him that is all about life.

SECOND LESSON LUKE 6.12-16

The lesson from the Gospel according to Luke, chapter 6, beginning at verse 12.

Jesus went out to the mountain to pray; and he spent the night in prayer to God. And when day came, he called his disciples and chose twelve of them, whom he also named apostles: Simon, whom he named Peter, and his brother Andrew, and James, and John, and Philip, and Bartholomew, and Matthew, and Thomas, and James son of Alphaeus, and Simon, who was called the Zealot, and Judas son of James, and Judas Iscariot, who became a traitor. 'I have said these things to you while I am still with you. But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I have said to you.


