We are committed to work and pray towards a more just settlement for all Indigenous people and pay our respect to First Nations people with us.

St Peter's Cathedral is a Christ-centred, sacramental, inclusive, thinking, mission-oriented faith community.

Tonight our worship is enriched with two special events.

First, we welcome two new members to the Cathedral Chapter: the Venerable Andrea McDougall, Archdeacon of Sturt, and Lay Canon Peter Burke, appointed by the Diocesan Council.

Secondly, we celebrate the launch of the Rev'd Canon Jenny Wilson's new book *Preaching for the Planet*. Following the success of her first collection of sermons *Keeping Watch for Kingfishers: God Stories*, we were delighted when UK publisher Sacristy Press sought a further collection with a particular focus on creation and climate change. We are delighted and honoured that Her Excellency the Honourable Frances Adamson AC, Governor of South Australia, has kindly agreed to launch the book.

I personally welcome the many guests who have come to support Peter, Andrea, and Jenny. We are blessed at the Cathedral with many people who seek to serve not only the Cathedral but the whole of Adelaide through loving service.

SECOND LESSON ACTS 1:1-8

The lesson from the Acts of the Apostles, chapter I, beginning at verse I.

In the first book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus did and taught from the beginning until the day when he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. After his suffering he presented himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them over the course of forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While staying with them, he ordered them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for the promise of the Father. 'This', he said, 'is what you have heard from me; for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now.'

So when they had come together, they asked him, 'Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.'


