THE BLESSING OF THE LADY CHAPEL PASCHAL CANDLE

Standing near the large Paschal Candle, the Archbishop says

Dear friends, today we celebrate the glorious resurrection of Jesus Christ, his triumphant victory over sin and death. May this candle shine in our midst to remind us of the paschal mystery in which we share and which is made present in our midst daily.

Let us pray.

Amen.

God our Father, source of all light, bless this candle and make it holy. Through its presence among us may the light of Christ, risen in glory, dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds.

The Lady Chapel Paschal Candle is blessed with Holy Water and incense. It is inscribed with the Cross, the Alpha and Omega, and the numerals of the current year.

Christ yesterday and today, the beginning and the end, Alpha and Omega, all time belongs to him, and all ages: to him be glory and power through every age and forever.

Five nails, symbolising the wounds of Christ, are inserted into the Candle.

By his holy and glorious wounds, may Christ our Lord guard us and keep us. **Amen.**

The Lady Chapel Paschal Candle is lit from the Paschal Candle blest at the Easter Vigil this morning.

May the light of Christ, rising in glory, banish all darkness from our hearts and minds.

FIRST READING ACTS 10:34-43

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Then Peter began to speak to them: 'I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ - he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name.'

SECOND READING

1 CORINTHIANS 15:19-26

A reading from Paul's first letter to the Corinthians

If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied.

But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died. For since death came through a human being, the resurrection of the dead has also come through a human being; for as all die in Adam, so all will be made alive in Christ. But each in his own order: Christ the first fruits, then at his coming those who belong to Christ. Then comes the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, after he has destroyed every ruler and every authority and power. For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. The last enemy to be destroyed is death.

Please stand to sing the Gradual Hymn

THE GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

The choir sings the alleluia, which is repeated by the congregation. After the verse, the alleluia is sung again by all.

The procession moves to the centre of the Nave. The Deacon reads

The Lord be with you.

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke.

On the first day of the week, at early dawn, they came to the tomb, taking the spices that they had prepared. They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they went in, they did not find the body. While they were perplexed about this, suddenly two men in dazzling clothes stood beside them. The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, 'Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners, and be crucified, and on the third day rise again.'

Then they remembered his words, and returning from the tomb, they told all this to the eleven and to all the rest. Now it was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women with them who told this to the apostles. But these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them. But Peter got up and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves; then he went home, amazed at what had happened.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Dear friends, through the paschal mystery we have been buried with Christ in his baptism, so that we may rise with him to new life.

The Archbishop pours water into the font and leads

THE BLESSING OF THE WATER

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

We give you thanks that at the beginning of creation your Holy Spirit moved upon the waters to bring forth light and life. With water you cleanse and replenish the earth; you nourish and sustain all living things.

Thanks be to God.

We give your thanks that through the waters of the Red Sea you led your people out of slavery into freedom, and brought them through the River Jordan to new life in the land of promise.

Thanks be to God.

We give your thanks for your Son Jesus Christ: for his baptism by John, for his anointing with the Holy Spirit.

Thanks be to God.

We give you thanks that through the deep waters of death, Jesus delivered us from our sins and was raised to new life in triumph.

Thanks be to God.

We give you thanks for the grace of the Holy Spirit who forms us in the likeness of Christ and leads us to proclaim your kingdom.

Thanks be to God.

And now we give you thanks that we are made one with Christ in his death and resurrection. May this water be a sign of our new birth in Baptism. May we continue forever in Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Spirit, now and forever.

Amen.

THE RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL VOWS

Now that our Lenten observance is ended, let us reaffirm the promises we made in baptism.

he descended to the dead.
On the third day he rose again;
he ascended into heaven,
and is seated at the right hand of the Father;
from there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

This is the faith of the Church.

This is our faith.
We believe in one God:
Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Amen.

Will you each, by God's grace, strive to live as a disciple of Christ, loving God with your whole heart, and your neighbour as yourself, until your life's end?

May God keep us faithful to our calling




