

Welcome to St Peter's Cathedral. We are delighted to have you worship with us today for this service of Choral Evensong from the Book of Common Prayer. As the clergy and choir lead this service, allow the words and music to bring you into a stillness and prayerful reflection with God. Please join us in saying the words in bold. The hymns can be found in the separate hymn book. Indications for sitting, kneeling, and standing are a guide only.

St Peter's Cathedral resides on the lands of the Kurna people. We give thanks for their ancestors and acknowledge the ongoing right and responsibility of their elders to care for this Country. We are committed to work and pray towards a more just settlement for all Indigenous people and pay our respect to First Nations people with us.

St Peter's Cathedral is a Christ-centred, sacramental, inclusive, thinking, mission-oriented faith community.

On this Sunday, we commemorate with thanks, our distinctively Christian understanding of God as One in a co-equal trinity of different forms of being. With Wisdom, God the Creator, spoke the cosmos into being (Psalm 33:9). With all that is in it, the cosmos expresses the Creator's love and truth. Those who hunger and thirst for knowledge of God's love and truth, come in simplicity to listen to the Holy One (Proverbs 9:10).

For us, the Holy One is God's Wisdom personified in God the Son, Jesus Christ. Those who come to the Son may not see themselves as wise, but even with just a grain of faith, they have begun to be so.

Then, just as God's Spirit came to Jesus' apostles at Pentecost, so that same Holy Spirit comes today. Those emptied of self, longing to experience the reality of God's love for them, the truth and power of it, are filled and sent out. May our faith in God as Holy Trinity, three persons relating to each other in love and truth, so act in the world that God's faithful loving kindness may continue to be seen.

The lesson from the book of Proverbs, chapter 8, beginning at verse 32.

‘And now, my children, listen to me:

watching daily at my gates,
waiting beside my doors.
For whoever finds me finds life
and obtains favour from the Lord;
but those who miss me injure themselves;

Cathedral Close Paving

The Cathedral Council receives a Health and Safety report at each meeting. A current concern is the uneven paving in the Cathedral Close outside the John Dunn Room, caused by tree roots. This high-traffic area has already seen trips and falls, so action is needed. Options include: raising the ground level with infill and repaving; replacing the paving with a deck above root level; or removing the tree and incorporating new plantings and shade solutions in the repaving.
