Welcome: Up until a few years ago it was common custom for Good Friday services to be three hours long and shaped around the 'Seven words from the Cross'. One of those 'words' appears in today's Gospel reading when Jesus prays that his executioners may be forgiven – "Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing." Also spoken from a cross, but not by Jesus, is a prayer by the thief crucified alongside Jesus, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." (Luke 23: 34 & 42) As we celebrate the final Sunday of the liturgical year, with the theme "Christ the King", the invitation is there to explore what is understood by kingship and kingdom – words which have little traction today. The biblical concept of kingship was rich and varied and included the ideas of bringing order and justice to the world, enabling people (through peace upheld) to reach their full potential, and for all to be a blessing to each other.

Welcome to all who worship Christ as King today, and may God's kingdom come on earth as in heaven.

Woe to the shepherds who destroy and scatter the sheep of my pasture! says the Lord. ² Therefore, thus says the Lord, the God of Israel, concerning the shepherds who shepherd my people: It is you who have scattered my flock, and have driven them away, and you have not attended to them. 
