**Welcome** to our time of worship together. This evening, during our service, the new chair of the Anglican Board of Mission, Rev Paul Devenport, will be commissioned by our Archbishop. Founded 171 years ago, ABM has proclaimed the Good News across Australia and beyond. Our Bible readings this evening contain verses that inspire such proclamation - 'that all peoples, nations, and languages should serve him' (Daniel 7:13b) and 'I ... will draw all people to myself' (John 12:33) immediately come to mind. ABM, through its history, has always sought to learn from encounter with other cultures and contexts and today has done much to develop new means of conversation to enable such encounters to be deep, meaningful and respectful. Their website (www.abmission.org) is well worth reading; and there, for example you will come across an online study 'God was on both sides of the beach' prepared for this year's 150th anniversary of the Coming of the Light, an annual celebration of ABM working in the Torres Strait communities. We may reflect on this as we sing our final hymn this evening, including the penultimate verse: 'To all life thou givest, to both great and small/ in all life thou livest, the true life of all/ we blossom and flourish as leaves on the tree/ and wither and perish; but naught changeth thee.'

Amen.

#### **Absolution**

Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who desireth not the death of a sinner, but rather that they may turn from their wickedness, and live; and hath given power and commandment to his Ministers, to declare and pronounce to his people, being penitent, the Absolution and Remission of their sins: He pardoneth and absolveth all them that truly repent and unfeignedly believe his holy Gospel. Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. Jesus answered them, 'The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honour.

'Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say — "Father, save me from this hour"? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name.' Then a voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.' The crowd standing there heard it and said that it was thunder. Others said, 'An angel has spoken to him.' Jesus answered, 'This voice has come for your sake, not for mine. Now is the judgement of this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out.
